And at Eastercon 2020, also online, I set up a fan table in my garden, which is probably the only time anyone has tried to sell a membership to a bee! Since then, we have been on site many times. It has become traditional for team members to pat the Clyde Auditorium for luck! If you pat your Armadillo, maybe she'll even grant the odd wish.

My Vision for this Worldcon is something we have striven for since the beginning. To be Inclusive, Caring and Imaginative has been embedded in the decisions we have made. Considering access, inclusion and diversity as integral to Glasgow 2024 has created an environment where we think carefully about what Worldcon can become – a convention to represent all of our futures as well as a place where everyone can celebrate, and an event where we can take these realities joyfully forward after it is over.

Far Out Artist

My first exhibit at a convention was at Novacon in 1976, where I displayed 10 pieces of art and holy cow, I sold them all! I was a newly enrolled student at art college, so leaving the con with the princely sum of £111 in my pocket was rather fabulous.

So here I am, decades later and invited to be Artist Guest of Honour at Glasgow 2024; so how the heck did I get here?

It all starts with a bookshop. Andromeda Science Fiction Bookshop in Birmingham to be precise. Andromeda became like a second home to me, with the owners Rog Peyton and Rod Milner alongside Dave Holmes, constantly encouraging me. I doubt that I would have had quite the artistic career that I've achieved without them.

My very first piece of published art was, in fact, an Andromeda book catalogue. A few years later Dave suggested that I submit a piece for the Ken Slater Award at Novacon. Ken, of course, was a huge fan, a British Science Fiction Association (BSFA) founder and a former guest at conventions himself. That year the submission was to depict a scene from *The Tower of Glass* by Robert Silverberg. I submitted a multi-page narrative, illustrated in a comic book style and although I didn't actually attend the convention, wonder of wonders, I won the prize of £10! After this, I began attending conventions regularly, meeting professional artists I had long admired, such as Eddie Jones and David Hardy. Jones sometimes used the pseudonym S. Fantoni and because of this, I had started to use the handle Fangorn. I wasn't a Lord of the Rings fan. I just thought it sounded cool and I have used it ever since!

At Eastercon in 1978, I met Steve Jackson and Ian Livingstone of Games Workshop and they commissioned me to produce black and white drawings for the interior of their fledgling *White Dwarf* magazine. A short time later, I was given the cover of the second issue; things were definitely picking up!

I continued exhibiting and selling at conventions, improving my artistic skills, and with Rog, Rod, and Dave's input, I received my first book cover commission with the British publication of Robert Asprin's *Another Fine Myth*. I had been reading the series years before,



due in no small part to the lovely Kelly Freas covers, so the opportunity to paint the British versions was rather special. My first heavyweight fantasy book cover commission came with Adrian Cole's *A Place Among The Fallen*. Slowly but surely, more work came my way, including Brian Jacques' *Redwall* series. Games Workshop also continued to offer me work, so eventually I handed in my notice at the Design Studio where I'd been working and plunged into the precarious world of the freelance artist.

Some years later, the opportunity to illustrate the graphic novel of David Gemmell's novel *Legend* came along, thanks to my friends Mike Llewellyn and Freda Warrington. Gemmell and the publishers were looking for an artist and while staying with the Gemmells, Mike and Freda threw my name into the hat. The only professional comic strip work I had done up to that point was a two-page strip published in the second issue of *Starburst* magazine. However, I got the gig, with 96 pages of comic art and a cover to produce; talk about throwing myself into the deep end!

Move on a year or so, and while working on *Wolf in Shadow*, another graphic novel adaptation of a David Gemmell work, I received a phone call from Ken Slater, which went something like, "Chris, how would you feel about working for Stanley Kubrick?"

Ken, as a bookseller, had been supplying reference material to Kubrick's people and the graphic novel of *Legend* had caught Stanley's eye. He was keen to meet the artist and because Ken and I knew each other through conventions, he was able to pass on my contact details to Kubrick's assistant, Tony Frewin. A short time later I received an envelope emblazoned with a Warner Brothers logo.

Over the next few months, I met with Stanley and Jan Harlan (Kubrick's brother-in-law and executive producer), and was invited to read a treatment that author Ian Watson had a major hand in. This, of course, was based on the Brian Aldiss short story "Super Toys Last All Summer Long".

This was to become Kubrick's film *A.I.*

Even now, after all this time, having met and worked with Stanley Kubrick still feels quite surreal.

I went on to spend nearly two years, five days a week, producing concept designs for *A.I.* I also did a stint on *Eyes Wide Shut*, working up designs for the costume shop and an erotic dream sequence which, ultimately, wasn't worked into the film. Obviously, Stanley chose to make *Eyes Wide Shut* in preference to *A.I.* but with the notion that we would come back to *A.I.* once that film was completed.

Of course, Stanley's untimely death came as a real blow to everyone but some months later, Jan Harlan contacted me. *A.I.* was back on as a project, however he refused to tell me who the director was.

Several weeks later, I was in conversation with Steven Spielberg.

Spielberg was keen for me to continue the design work I had been producing for Kubrick. He also wanted me to storyboard other sequences in the film, which was yet another exciting opportunity. After completion of my work on what became *A.I. Artificial Intelligence*, I was drafted to work on *The Time Machine*, again producing concept design and storyboards for that film. I was then invited to join the crew of *Road to Perdition* and storyboard for Sam Mendes. Given that I'd loved *American Beauty*, this was a fantastic experience to work closely with Sam.

Sometime after returning to England, I received a call from Dennis Gassner, the Production Designer I had met on *Road to Perdition*. Dennis was working on another film and the director was looking for a storyboard artist, so Dennis figured he'd hook us up. The film was *Big Fish* and the director turned out to be Tim Burton.

After an initial stint working with Tim in the UK, we headed out to Montgomery, Alabama, to join the rest of the crew, which turned out to be a fascinating and highly enjoyable experience and oh the parties we had! My relationship with Tim continued beyond that film and I proceeded to work on *The Corpse Bride*, *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*, *Alice in Wonderland* and *Dumbo*.

Work in the film industry continued apace with a number of genre films, including *War of the Worlds*,

Indiana Jones and The Kingdom of the Crystal Skull and *Ready Player One* for Spielberg, *The Golden Compass*, *Gravity*, *Star Wars: The Force Awakens* and three Bond movies. Working with Sam Mendes again, on *Skyfall* was a particular highlight. My first dive into live action TV was with *The Man Who Fell to Earth* series. Work in animation has also come my way with the *Redwall* TV series and a stint at Aardman Animation with designs for *Arthur Christmas*. My most recent work has been storyboards for *A Quiet Place: Day One*, which I thoroughly enjoyed.

I still like to produce work for print when the opportunity arises. I have produced a number of digital covers for Ian Whates at NewCon Press. A particular highlight was providing a series of paintings for a deluxe edition of Stephen Kings *Salem's Lot*, for Pete Crowther at PS Publishing. I've also managed to pick up a couple of BSFA Awards for my book covers along the way.

As much as I enjoy working in film I've tried to devote more time to my personal art: painting, drawing, sculpting and printmaking. There is still so much more I'm eager to accomplish in these mediums, some of which I'll be talking about at this convention.

To be invited as Artist Guest of Honour at Glasgow 2024 is a seriously proud moment for me and is a culmination of having met so many lovely people over the years. A big thank you to all those who have encouraged me, who have commissioned work, and to those who have ever bought my artwork, I salute you.

What an absolute pleasure it is to be here! ■

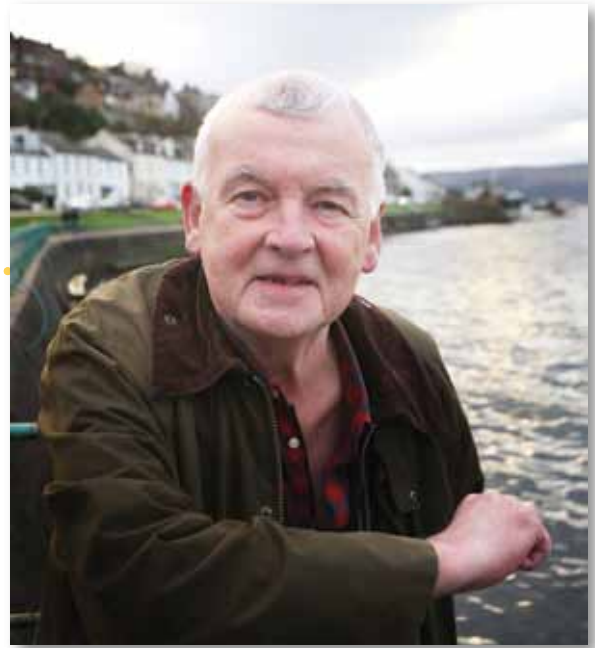

A Unique Perspective



Ken MacLeod was born in 1954 on the Isle of Lewis and now lives in Gourrock on the Firth of Clyde. He has degrees in biological sciences, worked in IT, and is now a full-time writer. He is the author of twenty novels, from *The Star Fraction* (1995) to *Beyond the Light Horizon* (2024) and many articles, short stories, and poems. He has won three British Science Fiction Association (BSFA) awards and three Prometheus Awards, and been short-listed for the Clarke, Nebula, and Hugo Awards.

His work has been widely translated and ranges from near-future dystopia to far-flung space opera, drawing on his first-hand knowledge of biological science, information technology, and political activism. An experienced speaker, event chair and organiser, he has given talks, workshops and readings at public events, libraries, universities and schools. He has taught science fiction writing at Moniack Mhor in Scotland, Arvon in England and Clarion West in the US.

In 2009 he was Writer in Residence at the Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) Genomics Policy and Research Forum at Edinburgh University, and in 2013 and 2014 was Writer in Residence at the MA Creative Writing course at Edinburgh Napier University. He was Guest Selector for the SF strand at the 2017 Edinburgh International Book Festival. ■

Ken MacLeod: An Appreciation

My introduction to Ken MacLeod came, appropriately, at the first Glasgow Worldcon in 1995. As a brand new writer, wandering the Scottish Exhibition & Conference Centre's cavernous halls with saucer-wide eyes, seeing famous authors from all over the world walking right by me was mind-blowingly exciting. On the other hand, Scottish SF&F novelists (with the notable exception of Iain M. Banks) were considerably less conspicuous in those crowded hallways, but here was a new guy launching his first novel. It was called *The Star Fraction* and it looked pretty cool.

John Jarrold, publisher at Random House at the time, recalls being approached by Ken's agent, Mic Cheetham, about the novel:

It arrived by courier later that day - a big, chunky MS, which I put into my bag and started reading on the train home that evening. I had a 90-minute journey. Within three or four pages I knew this was very special. In the classic publishing cliché, I stayed up until 3 am reading, and finished the book. The next day I told the Publishing Director I intended to publish it! It is still one of the most important and best debuts with which I've ever been associated.

John isn't wrong. Over the subsequent almost three decades, Ken MacLeod has gone on to blaze a trail through the science fiction firmament that is uniquely his own.

At the time, it definitely felt like a moment. Doubly exciting, for me, to have a new Scot on the block. And when I got around to reading *The Star Fraction*, I too was blown away. Not only because it was great science fiction – of course, it was! – but because the story had such a totally different vibe to everything else I'd been reading at the time. It was unashamedly political, wildly imaginative, and had characters I could really relate to. Pragmatic people, with a grounded sense of humour. Ones that felt like the people I'd grown up with. Immediately, I knew I'd found a writer who spoke to me.

The more Ken MacLeod you read, the more you come to realise that while he appears to be intensely interested in everything, there are some themes he returns to. Politics remains an obsession. He may have mellowed since his leftie student activist days and early novels, but he's still having fun spinning new variations on global politics. Famously not a fan of Scottish Independence,

there's no missing the gleeful irony of Scotland joining up with the European bloc ('The Union') in his recent *Lightspeed* trilogy, while England aligns with the remaining anglophone world in 'The Alliance' (inverting the Union of the UK and Scotland's ancient Auld Alliance with France).

He returns often to the subject of AI too as a way of exploring ongoing thoughts on the dovetailing of computing developments and socialist planning. In the recent novels especially, his anticipatory algorithmic artificial intelligences (triple-AIs) prove persuasively adept tools with which to run a society. You can also regularly spot the lingering fascinations of his zoology degree, for example in the marine environments depicted in *Cosmonaut Keep* and *Selkie Summer* and in the terraformed world in *Beyond The Hallowed Sky* and its sequels.

Ken has, I think, a real love for the history of the genre as well. He loves to interrogate it, play with it, and often litters his stories with deliciously witty Easter eggs for those in the know. Going back to faster-than-light travel as the MacGuffin of his most recent series, for example. Or reframing 1984 in terms of where we are now in the wonderfully meta title story of his new collection, *A Jura For Julia*, which sees the character Julia travel to the Inner Hebridian island of Jura where, in our world, Orwell wrote that book.

And this is the second part of what excites me about Ken MacLeod since that book launch back in 1995. Ken isn't just a Scottish SF writer, he's also a writer who deeply cares about Scotland itself. About her people, about her landscapes, both natural and political, and about her future. Telling our stories along with everyone

else's, at last. I say 'at last' because very few people had done that before.

This isn't any kind of claim for Scottish exceptionalism. Ken is as international a writer as you could hope for, but he does seem to be writing about Scots with increasing frequency these days. In the excellent *Beyond The Hallowed Sky*, again, his depiction of the Grants who are instrumental to Scotland (and The Union) belatedly joining the FTL-enabled nations have exactly the blend of engineering pragmatism and can-do attitude you'd need to just go ahead and turn a submarine into a spaceship. *Newton's Wake's* Winter and Calder are a pair of scurrilous folk musicians who are instantly recognisable if you're familiar with the music circuit. *The Night Sessions*, an Edinburgh police procedural, thoughtfully examines our relationship with religion. In *Selkie Summer*, we travel to Skye and the waters around it. In *The Highway Men*, it's the post climate change landscape of the Highlands.

If you're looking for great, thoughtful science fiction, Ken MacLeod is as good as they come. If you're looking for acute insight into the concerns of modern Scotland through an SF lens, you could have a better guide. And if you're a young Scottish writer, looking for permission to write the stories of your people, let me tell you Ken MacLeod is not only warm, funny and unbelievably generous with his time. He's an absolute inspiration. ■

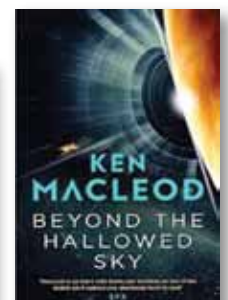
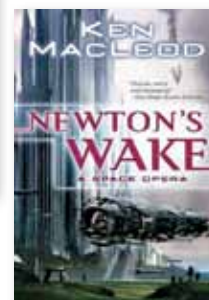
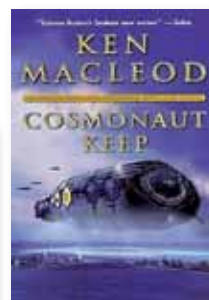

The Inspiration of Working With Nnedi

I'm not sure I can accurately count how many drawings and portraits I've created for Nnedi Okorafor's expansive and intimate novels and novellas to this date, but I do know I have never done so many book covers for a single author in my entire career, and it seems we're not done yet. Our process of making a cover is unique and skirts past a lot of the usual conventions of the process, and somehow we get away with it time and again.

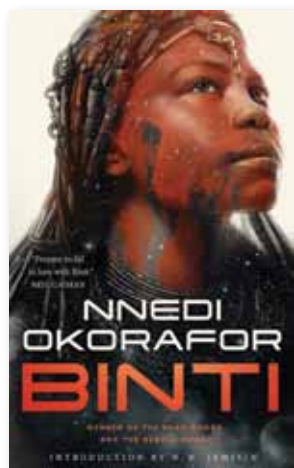
Nnedi manages a distinct but never ostentatious writing style to express her stories. She never let's the prose get in its own way, or style overtake the story being told, but the way in which she crafts a story is entirely distinctive. The places she crafts and the characters she builds when set next to the other giants of science fiction are wholly unique. They occupy space and time in a way few of us who write stories manage to achieve naturally. I miss them when they're gone. When I look back on portraits

I've created for her they all feel like people I've met and spent time with in my memory. She paints these vast galactic stories through the eyes and experiences of her characters. We are pulled into them, through them, and walk these planets and mythical landscapes in their shoes. Reading one of her books is like bathing in another world by occupying the body of one of its residents. It's why we always come back to portraiture to showcase her stories on the covers I've created for them. There's just no way around that essential aspect of how she builds a world and unveils the arc of living in it.

There's an inherent political/social element to the act of these books and their covers too. Sci-fi remains a largely white male dominated genre and while that's starting to finally change more actively, the very act of a female Nigerian writer telling stories of our future through an African perspective is a revolution. I don't think we've

heard a voice as strong and essential since Octavia Butler, nor needed such an expansive approach to the genre. Putting a Black woman proudly looking back at you from a cover in a world like this is an act of revolution. These women aren't sidekicks or damsels in distress. They can be prickly, complicated and outwardly hard to ignore as they can be sweet and kind and full of a kind of light that can captivate. Her characters respond to the world's they live in: rage against them; suffer the indignities of the oppressiveness that buttresses them; survive; endure; and elevate beyond.

Most authors and book cover artists don't interact in the design process. The Publisher tends to keep the Art Director and Editor between them as mediators in the process of making the cover work. There're a lot of really important reasons why this is almost always a good idea to keep the train running on its track. Authors tend to be overly attached to their work, as they should be. To be able to release the grip needed for creating and allowing a perfect stranger to paint a picture for them that will be the outward face of their creation is not easy. There're a lot of practical and even technical reasons why experienced cover work is best left to those who know how to best manage and craft it, but its also an author's first real outsider perspective on their own work, made physical before the reading public gets a hold of it. Authors and artists can sometimes have completely different languages for how they create and communicate that need a translator. Having managers in between this tricky process can be what literally makes it all work. But with Nnedi's books we seem to have been perpetually breaking that construct. Most artists



never even directly communicate with their authors at all, except maybe at the very end with a brief thank you for the work, or in the rollout of the cover reveal preceding the book's launching. That tends to be the most common dynamic. Nnedi and I seem to have blown that apart every time we work together on one of these books.


Having done so many together, now, there's a trust and familiarity between us that I think is unique. But even in the early days when we started establishing this partnership, (and I think that's the best way to describe it, a partnership), we sort of leapfrogged over the usual conventions. It seemed to begin with our first project, a German edition of *Lagoon*, for an overseas edition of the book. They wanted new art for it, and Nnedi and I being based in the U.S. made it an obvious thing to put us together as a short hand direct call and response dynamic to expressing the art.

Throughout a dozen covers that process has remained and even become habit. I hear from a publisher that there's a needed cover for a book and I immediately reach out to Nnedi to get one of her dense and incredibly essential briefs. She'll take a couple of days and work up a description of the character, the local or tribal specifics, tools, symbols, costuming and character traits, and how it all ties into the world she's crafted. I'll check in about specifics as needed, but generally take that brief as a launching point to start figuring out who this particular woman is, what she looks like and how she holds herself. All the usual Sci-Fi elements tend to be secondary to the character. They become the baubles she wears, or the background that bleeds into who she is, but these pieces tend to

always be about the person within the place rather than the usual spacey constructions you see in a typical cover for this genre. She and I will spend most of the time making one of these pieces in a private conversation between the two of us, trading sketches and drawings, tweaking a nose to fit what she might see in her head, or a manner of how she looks outward from herself. But to her credit, while Nnedi might have a very specific image of who one of her characters is, she's never trapped by that particular rule book, and she's open and even excited to see an interpretation of her work rather than a robotic reproduction of what she already sees in her mind's eye. My Binti and Dave Palumbos don't look the same, but both are true, for example. It's one of the things that really excites me about working with her – that moment when I've surprised her with a portrait and she screams out THAT'S HER! Sometimes that comes from a bunch of rounds of getting lost to find the right way. Other times it lands like that on the first approach, and the rest becomes polishing. Whatever the case, the process remains intact and the poor art director tends to be waiting for us to do our dance before I'll present the result. I think we've been lucky in working with terrific Art Directors who seem okay surrendering the process to us in this way, but I think the results of this unique relationship help prove its value.


When you're creating largely portrait based covers, especially about culturally specific characters, there's a LOT of research that has to go into the process, above and beyond even most historical- based novels I've worked on. Which is weird for a sci-fi story that is inherently invented fiction. But whether it's a deep dive into the Himba people through *Binti*, or the Ewu in *Who Fears Death*, there's always a terrific amount of detail and culturally specific objects and symbologies at play. It roots to the firmament of a real culture to build outward into the weird outer worlds she launches us into, but for most of us, me included, Nnedi also has to teach us about these real cultures while doing it as if it were also a new unknown place to grow from. The more you learn about them, the vast diversity, even within the borders of any specific African country, the tribal complexities and physical traits can be overwhelming. The ancient relationships, conflicts, and realities demand a detailed and rich understanding of themselves. What Butler taught us about slavery and the Black experience in America, Nnedi delivers for Africa and the diaspora. So whenever we start a new project I feel a tremendous obligation to respect its source material, its cultural importance, and the unique opportunity I have as a middle class white guy from Texas even playing in such a rare role in this. They are opportunities to learn and become aware for me personally. These projects grow

and expand my own understanding of the world we live in and the one we can inhabit through her explosively rich futurescapes. I think it's exactly this outsider perspective that helps deliver that same sense of discovery to the readers, to lure even the unfamiliar closer to the bookshelf, and pick up a copy when they might tend to reach for something more conventional and familiar out of habit. It makes what I do for her so important to me to do it right, to listen in the process, to pay attention to what she's saying in between what she's telling me, and to interpret honestly and loyally the sense of a living and breathing, complex and often conflicted character. I always imagine us both as Dr. Frankenstein in our castle-top lab sewing together and stitching these new creations into being, and only feeling satisfied when the lightening manages to wake them up and get them walking around the room we share with them. It is the most unique and also most expansively consistent inadvertent cover process I have ever been gifted to experience. I look forward to each and every new adventure, both as a reader and as an artist, and I'll never be able to thank Nnedi enough for the ongoing opportunity to play in such a magnificent and rich sandbox. ■

Terri Windling

Friend of Fairies



Terri Windling is a writer, editor, artist, folklorist, and life-long wanderer of mythic woods. She has published over forty books, receiving ten World Fantasy Awards (including the Life Achievement award in 2022), the Mythopoeic Award (for her novel *The Wood Wife*), the Bram Stoker Award, and the Science Fiction and Fantasy Writers of America (SFWA) Solstice Award for "outstanding contributions to the speculative fiction field". She's been shortlisted twice for the Shirley Jackson Award, and once for the Tiptree/Otherwise Award (for *The Armless Maiden*).

Terri has edited fantasy fiction for over forty years, working with many of the major writers in the field and co-creating such book publications as the *Fairy Tales* series of novels and the *Bordertown* urban fantasy series. She was a Senior Editor at Ace Books in the 1980s, a Consulting Fantasy Editor at Tor Books for two decades thereafter, and has edited numerous anthologies for adult and young readers, often in partnership with Ellen Datlow -- including sixteen volumes in *The Year's Best Fantasy & Horror* series, six volumes in the *Snow White, Blood Red* series of adult fairy tales, and four volumes of mythic fiction for Young Adult (YA) readers: *The Green Man*, *The Faery Reel*, *The Coyote Road*, and *The Beastly Bride*.

She has written fantasy for adult readers (including *The Wood Wife*, *The Color of Angels*, and a forthcoming novel, *The Moon Wife*), for YA readers (published in the *Bordertown* series), and for children (including *A Midsummer's Night's Faery Tale*, *The Winter Child*, and *The Changeling*). She also writes nonfiction on folklore, fairy tales, and fantasy literature for books, magazines, and academic publications (including *The Oxford Companion to Fairy Tales* and *Realms of Imagination: Essays from the Wide Worlds of Fantasy*), and has collaborated on books inspired by faery lore with artists/film designers Brian and Wendy Froud (including *Good Faeries/Bad Faeries* and the forthcoming *Wytch Words from the Edge of Faery*).

Raised in New Jersey and Pennsylvania, Terri lived and worked in New York City, Boston, and the Arizona desert before settling in Devon, England with her husband Howard Gayton, a British dramatist and puppeteer. They

have one grown daughter, a lively young dog, and a house crowded with books and puppets in a Dartmoor village full of artists. Working from a studio by the woods, Terri writes, edits, paints, curates a long-running mythic arts blog, *Myth & Moor*, and continues to share her love of fantasy and folklore in a variety of ways. She delivered the fourth annual *Tolkien Lecture on Fantasy Literature* at Oxford University (2016), participated in the year-long *Modern Fairies* folk music & arts project (Oxford and Sheffield Universities, 2018-2019), has been involved with The Centre for Fantasy and the Fantastic at the University of Glasgow since its founding in 2020, and served on the Advisory Board for the British Library's recent fantasy exhibition, *Realms of Imagination* (2023 - 2024). She is currently completing a new novel, creating art and stories for children (*The World of Bumblehill*) in collaboration with her daughter, recording lectures for the online Carterhaugh School of Folklore & Fantasy, co-creating myth-and-nature inspired live events with artists and ecologists on Dartmoor, and roaming the woods and hills each day, the source of her creative inspiration. The exhibition I'm putting together includes my own paintings and drawings, but also art by friends and neighbours – including illustrator and film designer Alan Lee (*The Lord of the Rings*), illustrators and film designers Brian and Wendy Froud (*The Dark Crystal* and *Labyrinth*), illustrator David Wyatt, and a number of other artists whose names might not be as well known but whose work is equally enchanting.

We are all inspired by the mythic landscape we share, but we express that inspiration in many different ways. I'm looking forward to sharing this art and this community with all of you ■.

Claire Brialey & Mark Plummer

An Interconnected Fannish Biography

Mark and Claire grew up a few miles outside Colchester in East Anglia, but in opposite directions and with a six-year age difference, so they didn't meet until 1986, at a pub meeting in London for ZZ9 Plural Z Alpha, the *Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* Appreciation Society. By that time Mark had been living and working in the city for several years and had started to attend SF conventions; Claire went to her first convention the following year, and later moved to Brighton to study before both of them wound up living in Croydon, with their respective partners at the time, and getting more closely involved in fan activity together.

Both had already been committee members for ZZ9; Mark branched out quickly into more established areas of fandom, becoming involved with the Friends of the SF Foundation and the British Science Fiction Association; Claire also joined the BSFA committee in due course, including acting as awards administrator (2004–2006 and 2008). She also administered the FAA (Fanzine Activity Achievement) awards in 2016, and was part of the jury for the Rotsler Award for fan art (2007–2014). However, she only managed two years (1998–2000) as a judge for the Arthur C. Clarke Award compared to Mark's three (1992–2005).

Claire had started to run small fun conventions in 1991 (Eroticon Six), followed by VoCon (1993), Inconceivable (1994) and Inconsistent (1996). This somehow led to joining the Board and committee for the 1995 Worldcon (Intersection), after which she turned to the committee for the 1998 Eastercon (Intuition) as light relief. Mark had taken to running Eastercon dealers' rooms from 1993 – in which role he would continue for over ten years – and was already working on that for Intersection when Claire co-opted him to Promotions as well. Both were members of the bid committee for the 2014 Worldcon, Loncon 3, and Mark continued to work as part of the chairs' staff through to the convention.

They worked together as part of the committee for Corflu (a fanzine convention) when it came to the UK in 2010 and 2015 and have found themselves doing so again for the 2025 con; they also put together the programme for ConRunner 4 (2017), and have worked on programme, publications, guest liaison and more for a number of Eastercons and British Worldcons. Claire has been on enough other con committees (most recently including the online Punctuation 2 in 2021, and the 2023 Eastercon, Conversation) to have lost count of how often she's given up con running afterwards.

Mark's fan activity – including other con running roles and an increasing amount of fan

historical research – has often been more behind the scenes, in early recognition of which he received both the Doc Weir Award and lifetime membership of the BSFA at the 1996 Eastercon. Claire was also presented with the Doc Weir Award in 2023, not least due to her long-term role as a minion for the fan funds. They were joint guests of honour at the UK Eastercon in 2001 (Paragon).

They independently resolved to get more involved in fanzines once the 1995 Worldcon was over; having each published one they decided it was simpler to merge the titles than to keep hitting each other up for articles, and the first joint issue of *Waxen Wings* and *Banana Skins* (shortened before too long to *Banana Wings*) appeared in 1996. Eventually life imitated fan activity and they merged their fanzine and book collections when they moved in together in 2004; they made it formal with a civil partnership in 2020.

Mark was a founder member (1993–2001) of the Acnestis APA, which Claire joined from 1995; she has been a member of The Women's Periodical since 2021, and they have contributed jointly to ANZAPA (Australian and New Zealand Publishing Association) since 2005.



They have each published occasional personal fanzines, the main titles deriving from their Acnestis APAzines, and have edited collections of other people's fan writing for conventions and fan funds; their own fanzines are not available online. Mark was also a columnist for the BSFA's *Matrix* (2003–2005) and for *Strange Horizons* (2011–2013); they have both been reviewers of SF books for the BSFA in particular. Claire has provided

proofreading, copy-editing and research assistance for a wide range of other convention, fan fund, and fan-related publications. They've won a plethora of fanzine awards, both together and for individual fan writing, including Claire's 2011 Hugo.

They are now both former civil servants. The dates in this make them feel older than they'd like to, but both Claire and Mark still enjoy science fiction and fandom. ■

Everyone has a story about Claire Brialey and Mark Plummer, it seems, or a reason to feel grateful to them. Fans extraordinaire; friends likewise

Mark Plummer's fan writing is quiet. Quiet and utterly brilliant. One could easily make the mistake of thinking it's effortless. Look closely, and you'll see the carefully-executed structure, the smooth flow. Claire Brialey's essays often leave me wondering how she got so deeply into my head and how she can express our shared thoughts so much more clearly and concisely than I merely dream of doing.

Some fan fund winners tend to stick around, helping out for years after they happily passed administrator duties on to the delegate who followed them. Claire has been helping both TAFF and GUFF in a multitude of ways for at least two decades without ever having stood as a candidate for either fund herself.

Most of all, Claire and Mark make fanac (fan activity) easier; they make it more fun. When I was getting close to publishing *Idea* last year, Mark offered to help with international distribution, just as he did for William Breiding's *Portable Storage*. When I was planning my TAFF trip back in 2019, Claire found the fares on Norwegian that meant I flew comfortably at a low cost. Fans around the globe can chime in with similar examples and experiences, all thanks to the generosity of Glasgow's fan GoHs.

Claire and Mark are well-known beer aficionados within fandom, so it was no surprise when they chose to contribute adult beverages to a Thanksgiving dinner for Randy Byers' family back in 2017. The surprise came when a Tree House Brewing Company gift card arrived in my mailbox, along with a note telling me they decided I deserved some adult beverages, too. I used that gift card for the very first pour I had at Tree House on my way to Smofcon a week later and, in the way such

things tend to grow, I've shared the love of Tree House beverages that started with that pour of Old Man ESB with hundreds of fans in the seven years since. Things Claire and Mark do tend to ripple out like that, making fandom a better, friendlier place for us all. ■

I started reading publications from the Fishlifters in around 1997, and admired the combination of workmanship and fannishness in both *Banana Wings* and BW. By the time we attended Corflu Leeds in 1998, I was eager to meet Claire and Mark properly in person. I'll leave you to guess which BW editor could be identified as the Vacuous Tart (it said so on their T-shirt). Somehow, through many shared conversations at the con and a couple of years exchanging fanzines, I still didn't know the story behind why they called themselves Fishlifters, indeed never gave it much thought. Until Aussiecon Three in 1999. As fans from all over the world assembled for the Worldcon, Caroline Mullan took the decision to invite us all to a party celebrating her anniversary in fandom. The party space was large, a sort of open plan two-level apartment with fans on both levels, but beverages on the lower level only. I was chatting to Claire and Mark on the upper level but decided it was time for refreshment. My progress toward the beverages was slow as I encountered more friends to greet. By the time I had secured a drink the party was heaving and having a conversation wasn't easy. I turned to contemplate a path through the crowd, toward Mark, who I could see on the upper level. He seemed to be telling a story, speaking with great animation, while rummaging around in his backpack. Then he pulled out – not a fanzine or a camera or even the Holy Grail, but an odd-looking spatula, which he waved about. The Fishlifter! And that's my Fishlifter Origin Story.

Ask Mark or Claire to tell you theirs, which I believe will begin 29 years ago at a Worldcon in a place called Glasgow . . . ■

There were lots of pubs, parties and conventions. Mark would sometimes write these up in his fanzine in an "impressionistic" way, along with stylistic "hommages" to Hunter S. Thompson etc. I liked these so much I nicked the idea. Claire was always an excellent content provider; if I ever needed another entendre she'd give me one.

My first encounter with Claire's writing would have been minutes of meetings, which were both longer and funnier than necessary. This tendency reached its height in cat-feeding instructions that ran to half a dozen leather-bound volumes and covered every possible contingency you'd find in a medium-sized multiverse.

Claire started getting involved in running conventions; from small and silly (Eroticon Six, VoCon, and Incon2) to huge (the '95 Glasgow Worldcon). It's possible this was just to make sure there was always a sales table that she could sit behind. Mark meanwhile started doing more serious things like running the dealers' room at Eastercons (though sometimes wearing a Romanian hat that looked like a grey, furry traffic cone), being involved with the Clarke award (Claire was also a judge later) and "drinking for the BSFA".

And so to 1995 and lots of us are staying in a couple of 26th floor flats in a dodgy part of Glasgow. An implement is found in a kitchen drawer and raised on high.

Lightning flashes.

Not all their work is visible: both have won the Doc Weir, the Eastercon award for unrecognised hard work and contribution to fandom.

Mark and Claire are connectors who bring people together from across the world. They like books, conversation, good beer and whisky. They are both excellent writers who make me think: Claire makes me cry; Mark makes me laugh. They are both awesome. ■

Then there were the awards. They'd both always done a fair amount of writing, but once they combined their considerable talents to produce a joint fanzine, they started winning lots of them, and deservedly so, though they did have to put up with us lesser mortals taking the mickey out of them.

It still seems a bit weird to think that my mates are now Guests of Honour at a Worldcon, and to me they really haven't changed that much, even if the fun is rather more sedate now. ■

Claire and Mark? Mark and Claire? They have been linked together for as long as I've known them. We "met" through the British APA *Acnestis*; it's all Yvonne Rousseau's fault. I joined *Acnestis* in 1995 because of the recommendation of my great friend Yvonne Rousseau. I was welcomed by Maureen Kincaid Speller, the Official Editor, and the *Acnestis* experience became a highlight of my life.

In *Acnestis* I discovered highly literate, witty and articulate fans who formed a group unequalled by almost any other group I've discovered. (The fans who founded and ran *Australian Science Fiction Review*, first series, formed my other special group.) Their knowledge of literature (including science fiction) and most other subject areas far surpassed mine. They wrote funny personal anecdotes, and brilliant reviews and articles. But apart from Maureen herself and Paul Kincaid, around whom things revolved, the most interesting and amusing writers were Claire Brialey and Mark Plummer. I was lucky – they liked my stuff as well.

In 1999 we met for the first time. Paul Kincaid was the GUFF winner, and it seemed that most *Acnestis* members followed him and Maureen to Melbourne, Australia, for *Aussiecon Three*, where I was Fan Guest of Honour. On one warm day, most of them visited the little house in Collingwood inhabited by Elaine Cochrane, me and five cats, and we all (except the cats) went on a bookshop hunt through inner Melbourne.

Mark and Claire decided that Australia was their second home, and visited here regularly in the years after *Aussiecon*. For reasons never explained, they dropped out of *Acnestis*, but in 2005, while we all visited *Corflu* in San Francisco, they asked to join ANZAPA, the Australian (and occasionally New Zealand) APA. I had just become Official Bloody Editor, so I knew my reign (which lasted 16 years) would be a success.

Claire and Mark's genzine *Banana Wings* is one of the few great fanzines of the last 50 years. Claire writes so well that she won a Hugo. Mark's support for me and my fanzines *SF Commentary* and *Steam Engine Time* has been astonishing. He is the only fan who could write a complete bibliography of all my fanzines. His letters of comment have been a highlight of any fanzine I publish.

Lucky the fan who meets and remains friends with fans like Claire and Mark! ■

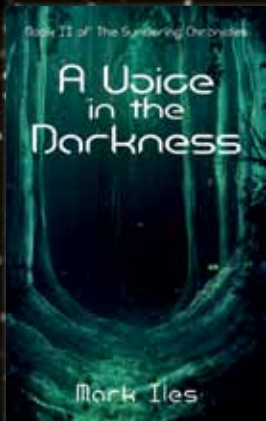

Catherine Heymans

Stepping Beyond

Prof. Catherine Heymans is the 11th Astronomer Royal for Scotland, appointed by Her Majesty the Queen in 2021, the first woman to hold this title in its 200 year long history. As Professor of Observational Cosmology at the University of Edinburgh and Director of the GCCL (German Centre for Cosmological Lensing) Institute at the Ruhr University Bochum, Germany, Catherine specialises in observing the dark side of our Universe using deep sky observations to test whether we need to go beyond Einstein with our current theory of gravity. In 2022 she became the youngest person to receive the Royal Astronomical Society's prestigious William Herschel medal for outstanding merit in observational astrophysics. She is a fellow of both the Royal Society of Edinburgh, and the Leopoldina, the National Academies of Scotland and Germany. Catherine is a regular contributor to BBC Radio and TV, providing expert comment for a wide range of physics and space stories. She authored "The Dark Universe", published as part of the Physics World Discovery Collection with the Institute of Physics. She also contributed to "Scotland in Space", twinning with sci-fi author Russell Jones to create the short futuristic love story "Scotland at the end of the Universe".

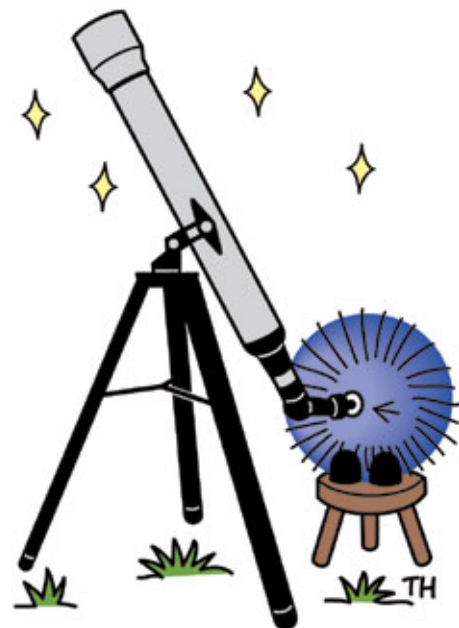
Catherine is currently part of a large international team preparing for first light at the Vera Rubin Observatory in Chile. As one of the largest telescopes in the world, Rubin will create the first movie of our Universe, looking for anything that moves in order to locate potential killer asteroids that could one day obliterate planet Earth! Catherine is certainly hoping that we won't find any evidence for that future doomsday scenario, with her true passion lying in the by-product of this search: the deepest widest view of the cosmos, the ultimate data set to unveil the origin of the mysterious dark energy that permeates our Universe.

Catherine's recent two-year long battle with Long Covid and her passion to nevertheless continue her scientific



research featured in a widely-shared Long Read article and podcast in the Guardian. Before the pandemic, Catherine appeared at music, art, philosophy, comedy, TED-x and science festivals. Worldcon will be the first time she returns to "the stage" since falling ill, made possible thanks to the full online access offered by Glasgow 2024.

Looking forward to her appearance, Catherine said "I've always loved the way that science fiction influences and drives scientists to think even bigger, and how scientists in turn inspire sci-fi writers to create and innovate new big dreams. Our communities spark off each other and I'm really looking forward to being part of the sparkle in Glasgow this summer!" ■



It's just as well my folks never watched *Trainspotting*. As a six-foot blonde, blue-eyed Fresher in Edinburgh the year the movie made box office history, I doubt they would have left me so readily had they seen that on-screen underworld beneath Edinburgh's picturesque and opulent facade. It was that same dark world I accidentally marched in to the day I answered a barmaid ad. As the door to the dingy pub slammed, all eyes quietly raised through the smoke-filled silence. The locals gave me the once-over, from my Spice-Girls wedged sandals up to my on-trend pink suede jacket. It was Begby (his chosen nickname) who spoke first. *"Aye, so long as she promises to wear that mini-skirt to each shift, she'll do."*

As time passed, we became unlikely bedfellows, a young English Astrophysics student serving lager with whiskey chasers till 1 a.m. to the most hard-working of men. The twists and turns of their lives, where the stakes seemed forever stacked against them, broke my heart. I didn't blame them for wanting to forget it all in the bottom of a pint glass.

My other job that year could not have been more contrasting. Tour guiding at the Royal Observatory, I lead tourists up the long spiral staircase of the century-old building that peers down on the city from high atop Blackford Hill. I never tired of the audible gasps in the cathedral-like dome that houses our towering telescope, one of the largest made in the 1930s. At night, the Guide and Scout groups would arrive from the more affluent parts of town. And as joyous as it was to have well-behaved children visit before I started my shift at the bar, it served as a constant reminder of Edinburgh's gulf between the wealthy and the deprived.

One day I heard that Begby had a grandson in Leith, *"goes down the Youth Group, mad about aliens and space he is."* A plan forms. I'll open the Observatory for free and Begby knows a man-with-a-van who can drive the Youth Group in return for some pints, on the house. The weather Gods are pleased, serving up a night of crystal clear skies, so I bring a telescope out on the rooftop. The kids are excited, but the tough-guy leader of the pack is playing it cool.

Me: *"Do you know anything about the planet Saturn?"*

Him: *"Everyone knows about Saturn lady, it's the one with the rings."*

Me: *"Take a look through the telescope."*

He looks. There is a long pause.

Him: *"That's a sticker."*

Me: *"No, it's not. See that bright star over there? That is Saturn, and this telescope is catching lots of its light and directing it all into your eye, so you can see the rings."*

Disbelievingly he looks at me, then at the back of the telescope searching for tricks and stickers. He looks at the sky, looks in the telescope's eyepiece, back at the sky again and then grins with a fantastic glint in his eye. The tough-guy act vanishes.

Him: *"It's no a sticker! It's Saturn! It's actually Saturn! Everyone you've go to come see this!"*

And that was the day I made it my mission to make astronomy accessible for absolutely everyone.

After I completed my degree, I bid a fond farewell to Begby and his entourage. With a PhD from Oxford, I travelled the globe, using some of the world's largest telescopes in Chile and Hawaii to construct vast surveys of the cosmos, mapping the mysterious web of invisible dark matter that dictates when and where the galaxies form. I became an Edinburgh Professor and to my surprise the Queen took note, appointing me her Astronomer Royal in Scotland. When asked what I might do in this new regal role, Begby's grandson was at the forefront of my mind.

The challenge with sharing one's love of astronomy in Scotland is always the unreliable weather. Organise any public stargazing event in advance and more often than not the clouds have other ideas. Thanks to Scotland's network of remote outdoor education centres, however, each week you'll find a captive audience of hundreds of primary school children on residential visits, sleeping under some of the world's darkest skies. Across the year nearly every school in Scotland will visit, and for some kids this will be the first time they leave the bright lights of the city. It's a perfect opportunity to show them the stars whenever the weather gods oblige.

With the Royal Observatory Trust, we're fundraising to install smart telescopes in each outdoor centre and train the staff how to use them. Glasgow Worldcon 2024 has generously sponsored a telescope for the Cairngorms! With the latest smartscope technology, you don't need a degree in Astrophysics to direct the telescope to see swirling spiral galaxies that are millions of light years away, or to zoom in on the vibrantly coloured billowing gas clouds called nebulae, where new stars are born. Our preteen visitors select the targets that they want to see and the robot-like smartscope leaps into action to show them exactly what is out there in our night sky. Our hope is that by providing an inclusive experience that enables all of our youth to make a spectacular first-person connection with the cosmos, more of them will

hold onto their childhood love of aliens and space. We want to combat the cultural misconceptions that teens experience every day, that *"science is boring"* and, if you're anything other than a well-off white male, that *"science is not for you"*.

The cosmos is humanity's last great wilderness and it should be accessible for everyone to immerse themselves in its diverse, colourful, and awe-inspiring beauty. My deep gratitude to everyone at Worldcon for helping me get one step closer in my mission to share the wonders of space with all of Scotland's youth. Dr. Meganne Christian FRAeS (Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society) is Reserve Astronaut / Exploration Commercialisation Lead at the UK Space Agency, developing strategy on human and robotic spaceflight in the post-ISS (post issuance compliance) landscape. In November 2022 she became a member of the European Space Agency astronaut reserve, one of the class of 17 candidates selected from a pool of over 22,500 applicants across Europe.

She holds a Bachelor of Engineering and a PhD in Industrial Chemistry from the University of New South Wales. From 2014 to 2023 she was a materials science researcher at the National Research Council of Italy, and participated in two parabolic flight campaigns to test graphene coatings for thermal management in satellites. She has also undertaken two missions, including a winter-over, to Concordia Station in Antarctica where she was a research scientist in charge of atmospheric physics and meteorology.

Why I Run

I spend a disturbing chunk of my waking hours communing with imaginary characters living in invisible worlds inside my head as though I was still that lonely kid in the corner of the playground. It's an incredible waste of consciousness. But that's my vocation. I pluck stories out of the ether and set them down, hopefully, for others to enjoy.

It's a very seductive thing, this, waking up in the morning and saying, "Let there be light". I may sit for a moment, an hour, or a day waiting for a word, a sentence, a scene. On some days it flows surely as water from somewhere on high. Other days, I sit there and nothing comes, not even in my dreams. My younger self would be embarrassed if I admitted that there is something mystical about writing. The longer I've done it, the harder it gets. I am but a conduit for stories that come from elsewhere, and while I get to put my name to them, they are not entirely mine. They are ideas floating about which we, the community of writers, cast ourselves as hooks and twine into the depths and reel out like fish from the ocean. We live in service to the story. But over time, like any piece of equipment, wear and tear happens. The laws of entropy are inescapable. That's fine, but we didn't evolve to have our head in the clouds like the giants of old whose ossified remains litter the Highlands and Islands. Ideas are seductive, but I am still but an ape from the savannah dragging my knuckles against the concrete and asphalt. My mind is merely the product of random grey matter sending electrical impulses to one another, and this is why I run.



For me, it started in spring 2018. Having been a couch potato for years, I decided to get moving again. It was hard at first. It's still just as hard, but all you have to do is move one leg after the other. This is what our ancestors (the ones who didn't get eaten by predators) did over many millennia. They did it because they had to – I have to as well. But I found the more I ran, the lighter I felt, physically and mentally.

When running goes well, you enter "the zone", this serene space in which you are motion itself, bounding along the Earth, and it feels like you can go on forever, running into the horizon and beyond. Paradoxically, running is an escape from the physical universe itself, and it takes you beyond the realm of thought into a space I can only describe as Unity. Oneness or Nothingness, I cannot decide which because it seems to dissolve the polarity that marks existence, good and bad, mind and body, yin and yang, that kind of thing. It became something I do to centre myself before the writing starts each morning. Edinburgh, where I live, is a



great city for runners and I happen to live near Union Canal, which is flat and free of traffic. I consider my morning run to be my commute since I work from home. That makes it my commute to the realm of story. In this, I believe the physical, the body, must perform the pilgrimage which takes me across to the ethereal. I feel sharper, more energised, and I can focus better through the day when I run.

This doesn't always last. There are bad days for running, bad months, extended periods too. When these times come, the writing suffers too. But I have come to expect these cycles – we are not machines; this is what it is to be human. It's okay. I give myself time and ponder what the universe is trying to tell me. Maybe I need a bit of a break. Perhaps I'm trying to force my work to go in the wrong direction. It could be I am neglecting my family and friends, the people that matter most, and I need to focus on that instead. Sure enough, as winter gives way to spring, the block passes and once again I can run, certain I am on the right path, doing what I was born to do. ■

T.L. Huchu's work has appeared in "Lightspeed", "Interzone", "Analog Science Fiction & Fact", "The Year's Best Science Fiction and Fantasy 2021", "Ellery Queen Mystery Magazine", "Mystery Weekly", "The Year's Best Crime and Mystery Stories 2016", and elsewhere. He is the winner of a Hurston/Wright Legacy Award (2023), an Alex Award (2022), the Children's Africana Book Award (2021), the Nommo Award for African SF-F (2022, 2017), and has been shortlisted for the Grand prix de l'Imaginaire (2019) and the Caine Prize (2014).

My main project at the moment is the Edinburgh Nights series. Books 1, 2 and 3, *The Library of the Dead*, *Our Lady of Mysterious Ailments*, and *The Mystery At Dunvegan Castle* are all out. *The Mystery at Dunvegan Castle* was published in the summer of 2023. I'm currently working on edits for Book 4 *The Legacy of Arniston Hall*, due out in October 2024.

I think at its heart, Glasgow 2024 is about meeting people, sharing ideas and nerding out. I very much enjoy meeting and chatting with new folks as well as those that I already know. A lot comes out of these encounters. Getting introduced to different art forms and concepts I might never have encountered otherwise is energizing. It's the people that make Worldcon, after all. ■

She's the creator and Creative Director of *Into the Mother Lands*, a Twitch supported RPG and Actual Play stream, airing weekly on her channel, twitch.tv/cypheroftyr. Additionally, she is a Senior Annenberg labs Civic Media Fellow at USC. She's also the creator and Creative Director of *Into the Mother Lands*, a new sci fi afro-futurist RPG developed with a team of all POC (People of Color) and Black creators; live streamed on her twitch channel, /cypheroftyr.

She's named as one of The Game Awards *Future Class* 2020, a diverse group of builders, thinkers and dreamers whose voices elevate and diversify our artform. It recognizes individuals around the world who represent the bright, bold and inclusive future for video games. She was also named as one of the Gamers of the Year

2020 by Kotaku along with three of her contemporaries. She was also invited to the Xbox MVP program in February 2021.

Her work to make the industry more inclusive has been highlighted in *Game Changer*, Directed by Tina Charles, WNBA star & Olympian as well as filmmaker. The short documentary premiered at Tribeca 2021, as part of the Queen Collective; an initiative started by Queen Latifah, supported by Proctor & Gamble in an effort to get more Black women into film making. *Game Changer* was also featured as part of BETHer's 2021 Juneteenth Programming on 19 June 2021.

Tanya is the programming & diversity coordinator for OrcaCon and GaymerX. She also serves on the Board of Directors for OrcaCon and was named the Chair for Take This in January 2023. She often speaks on issues of diversity, feminism, race, intersectionality & other topics at conventions. Her writing about games and games critique appears in *Uncanny Magazine*, *Polygon*, *Wiscon Chronicles*, *Vice Gaming*, *Paste Games*, *Mic*, and other publications. She's the editor of *Game Devs and Others: Tales from the Margins* (2018, CRC Press) and has contributed to *The Advanced Game Narrative Toolbox* (2019, CRC Press). ■

Fan Funds at Glasgow 2024

Fan funds exist to bring fans together and strengthen connections across SF fandom worldwide. They raise money to enable fans to travel to another country or region to attend a science fiction convention and meet other members of the SF community. First envisaged in the middle of the twentieth century, the funds continue to support fans to travel to represent fandom in their part of the world, find out more about fandom in the places they visit, and meet in person both existing and new contacts. Our exhibit at Glasgow 2024 has more information about fan fund delegates to European Worldcons.

Fan funds exist only through the generous support of fandom. Money for each trip comes partly from a small fee paid to vote in each race, with the rest raised by auctions at relevant conventions and online, sales of the reports written by fan fund delegates following their trips, and other activities and entertainments intended also to raise awareness of the funds.

The Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund (TAFF) was created in 1953, building on the success of the fund to enable Northern Irish fan Walt Willis to attend the 1952 Worldcon in Chicago and travel more widely in the USA. TAFF has been exchanging fans between Europe and North America on a nearly annual basis ever since; Sarah Gulde is the TAFF delegate at Glasgow 2024.

TAFF gave rise in 1972 to the Down Under Fan Fund (DUFF) which continues to run between North America and Oceania, followed in 1979 by GUFF between Oceania and Europe; this stands for either the Get Up-and-over Fan Fund or Going Under Fan Fund, depending on its direction. The GUFF delegate at Glasgow 2024 is Kat Clay.

Usually, delegates attend the Worldcon when it takes place in the destination continent. For eastbound TAFF races and northbound GUFF races the main destination has otherwise been the Eastercon (UK national convention). Southbound GUFF delegates have attended the Australian Natcon in the absence of a

Worldcon. While the first westbound trip to the NASFiC (held when the Worldcon is not in North America) was made in 2023. Some TAFF and GUFF delegates have also been able to attend the Eurocon, the New Zealand Natcon, and a variety of other conventions in North America and Europe as part of their trips.

Beyond these intercontinental funds, a network of other funds sends fans to meet their counterparts in other places. Some run between country groups, such as FFANZ (Australia and New Zealand), NoFF (the Nordic Fan Fund), and the relatively new EFF (European Fan Fund) which sends a delegate to the Eurocon each year. Some countries with extensive geography also have funds to send fans to national conventions, such as the Canadian Unity Fan Fund (CUFF) and the National Australian Fan Fund (NAFF).

There have also been fandom-specific funds, including several funds within the filk community and the Corflu 50 for fanzine fans, and occasional one-off funds – like JETS, which was part-funded by a surplus from Interaction, the 2005 Glasgow Worldcon to send a fan from Europe to Nippon '07 in Yokohama. Other one-off funds have been created for the sole purpose of bringing individual fans to conventions overseas. The connection between fan funds and the Worldcon has been strengthened with at least fifteen Worldcon chairs so far having also been, or become, fan fund delegates.

Today's fan funds exist alongside a range of other funding methods and mechanisms which assist fans from under-represented communities to attend conventions. By doing so, they broaden the range of participants in fandom as a whole, and so provide opportunities to share a wide range of perspectives on science fiction and its attendant community in a welcoming and inclusive context. As well as the current delegates, many past beneficiaries of fan funds will be at Glasgow 2024, and they will all be happy to tell you more.

TAFF is a magnificent thing. Sarah Gulde, your 2024 TAFF Delegate to the World Science Fiction Convention in beautiful Glasgow, is magnificent, too. She is *exactly* the kind of delegate you want representing North American fandom in the worldwide community that is Worldcon. I say this not only as one of the folks who nominated her for the role, but as a guy who once served as the TAFFster himself.

Let's start from the beginning – Sarah is cool. It's clear from the moment you meet her that there's an awesomeness about her; it isn't just rare, it might be unique. When I first met her (having heard her name a little previously, but never having interacted) it was on the streets of San Jose during Worldcon, and it was clear that she had what it took to be a TAFF delegate. I could tell instantly! She was funny, kind, outgoing, and (as I recall) was wearing a pirate's hat. She also came with the seal of approval from Randy Byers, former TAFF delegate and one of the finest humans who ever lived! That same year, she joined Team Journey Planet to co-edit an issue of the zine dedicated to *Star Trek*.

Let me digress a moment here; Sarah is a world-class *Star Trek* fan. She started watching when *Star Trek: The Next Generation* came out in 1987. Those were heady times; a generation of viewers had sprung up since the original series ended, and the new one became just as beloved. Sarah has that fan thing down pat. She collects memorabilia, including those collector's plates that I am so jealous of! She's collecting all the novels – more than 850 in total out there (including the best books that John M. Ford ever wrote) – and so much more. She loves *Trek*, and who can blame her? It also served as an entry point to our precious little realm of fandom, as it has since the series first debuted in the '60s.

Now, James Bacon and I asked Sarah to come on board and co-edit an issue with us dedicated to *Star Trek* while Sarah was making her first run at TAFF. She had never edited anything before; she had been a mathematics major in college. But it absolutely did not show! That issue, sub-titled "Infinite Diversity in Infinite Combinations", was an absolute master class in how it's done! Sarah sourced amazing articles looking at the ways in which *Trek* and its fandom had bettered the lives of those it touched, as well as some sparkling good cosplay photos! In the years since, she's co-edited two other issues with us, one on collecting and the other on small things (titled 'smol'). Both wonderfully expressed Sarah's vision.

That splendid *Trek* issue led to Sarah starting her own fanzine – *Star Trek Quarterly*. From the first issue, it was clear that it was going to be an important zine. Not only because the writing is exceptional, ranging from very personal stories to just plain silly fun! There's an entire issue dedicated to fan art that is wonderful, and also includes an article from Sarah that makes the writer in me exceptionally jealous. It's Sarah's vision, Sarah's editorial voice and how it comes through, that make it so impressive. Go ahead, go and read it. You'll not only come away with a better understanding of what *Trek* means, but you'll see for yourself how incredible Sarah's view is. Sadly, she's mentioned that this year, it will end its five year mission.

There is, of course, so much more to Sarah! She's been involved with various conventions in and around her home base of Portland, Oregon. Having discovered local fandom through *Trek*, she became the treasurer for Westercon 69, and then ended up getting a scholarship to Loncon in 2014, where she got to meet many fans from all over for the first time. As often happens, she ended up making a habit of attending Worldcons, possibly helped by the fact that she's been a Hugo Finalist three times. Once you get a taste, you want to enjoy the buffet that is fandom as often as possible!

So, if you're at Glasgow, or anywhere else she's visiting during her extensive TAFF trip, make a point of saying 'Hi'. You'll absolutely be better for having done it! TAFF makes it possible to meet the most amazing people. Make sure you do!

An Appreciation of Kat Clay

Kat Clay came bursting through the door of Melbourne's 2013 Continuum speculative fiction convention like a Raymond Chandler character and has been classing up the joint ever since, whether frocked up in Leona Edmiston faux vintage under leather jacket or cosplaying Mina Harker from the League of Extraordinary Gentlemen. Not her only cosplay, of course – her other award-winning creations include Yennefer of Vengerberg, Aloy from Horizon Forbidden West, and the 'Overburdened Wastelander'.

Meanwhile, back in the mainstream, Kat holds a Bachelor of Arts in Media Arts and Production, a Bachelor of International Studies in French – she spent a year studying at the Universite de Poitiers – along with a Graduate Diploma in Creative Writing from University of Technology, Sydney. Rumour has it she's lived in South Korea as well, no doubt working undercover on a secret mission (she could tell us but then she'd have to kill us).

Kat Clay is the Head of Digital Communications at Grattan Institute, with over a decade of experience in digital content and creative services across the non-profit and government sectors. She hosts podcasts, moderates webinars, and is the voice behind social media accounts. She is particularly interested in the influence of technology and social media on public policy.

But who is Kat Clay? Who is she really? She admits to having been raised on Star Trek, describing herself as a second-generation Trekkie. "We used to put Star Trek figures on the nativity scene – Guinan was one of the wise men and Worf was the angel."

Kat's own creative work encompasses a wide range of themes and genres, from historical fiction to crime and cosmic horror to dark fantasy and the weird. She's fascinated by sinister cities, arcane history, haunted

photography, 19th century literature, and the impact of technology on humanity. When she tires of being a melodramatic Gothic romance and history nerd, Kat returns to her singular love, Miss Jane Austen.

She's held fan blogs in various forms for many, many years, where she reviewed SF-F books, games, and movies. Did I mention the cosplay? Definitely worth mentioning again, as you'll often find her wearing outrageous outfits to the masquerade or panels. Turn on a karaoke machine and she'll come running! "I get so much creative energy from being around like-minded people."

Kat's short stories have been published in *Interzone*, *Aurealis*, and *Cosmic Horror Monthly*, to name a few. And in the past few years, she's moved into game writing for the Call of Cthulhu TTRPG (Tabletop Role-Playing Games), system, with great success. Her two scenarios, *The Hammersmith Haunting* and *The Well of All Fear*, have become bestsellers on DriveThruRPG, and she recently contributed to an upcoming *Cthulhu Invictus* book from Golden Goblin Press.

But it's not all fun and tentacles. Kat collects science fiction and related works from the 50s and 60s. She contributed an essay on Judith Merrill to the Locus award winning and Hugo nominated *Dangerous Visions and New Worlds*. Says Kat, "I'm interested in writing about the history of science fiction and fantasy, reading classic works, and looking more broadly at the history of SF movements outside the US and UK."

Now and then she pauses for breath before spreading literary love on YouTube. Check out her channel for tips on such matters as the plotting of crime novels while avoiding 100-year-old tropes, or researching historical fiction. Narrowing parameters is a good place to start. You'll find nifty tricks for reading 52 books a year – it all starts with choice – manuscript formatting in Word, scoring an agent and the seven deadly sins of book cover design, because Kat is a graphic designer too, of course she is.

So, what hasn't Kat Clay ticked off her life list already? Visiting Scotland, or Worldcon! Now is the time and this is the place. She's very friendly, so rock on up and say hello. Yes, that's her with the big red lipstick smile and utterly gorgeous swishy ankle length frock. Turning up and having fun is her superpower and she'll be turning the dial up to 11 representing Aussie spec fic fandom at Glasgow 2024.

Glasgow Around the World

It has been said that Scotland's greatest export is its people.
This could also be said of Glasgow, its largest city.

Towns, cities and geographic features around the world bear the name "Glasgow" in several countries on four continents.

The Glasgow Connection

Most Distant

- **Mount Glasgow**, in the Glasgow Range on New Zealand's South Island.
Distance from Glasgow: 18395 km (11430 miles)
Mount Glasgow rises 1424 m (4672 feet) above sea level. Climbing season is from November to March.

Closest

- **New Glasgow, Prince Edward Island, Canada**
Distance from Glasgow: 4063 km (2524 miles)
Founded in 1820, with a permanent population around 1000, New Glasgow PEI is famed for its lobster suppers, served from June to September.

Oldest

- **Glasgow, Delaware, USA**
Distance from Glasgow: 6746 km (4192 miles)
Founded in 1682 by William Penn, and settled by many Scottish immigrants over the centuries, Glasgow is a suburb of Philadelphia. Its population is 15405 (2022).

18th Century Glasgows

- **New Glasgow, Nova Scotia, Canada**
Distance from Glasgow: 4128 km (2565 miles)
New Glasgow was founded in Nova Scotia in 1784. Scottish settlers evicted by enclosures came to a part of Canada with a similar climate. New Glasgow is also home to the beautiful Glasgow Hills golf course. Its population is 9465 (2022), and the town is celebrating its 240th anniversary in 2024.
- **Glasgow, Kentucky**
Distance from Glasgow: 6193 km (3848 miles)
Founded in 1799, Glasgow, KY was named after Glasgow, the hometown of its founder, William Logan. It is celebrating the 225th anniversary of its founding in 2024. It is near Mammoth Cave National Park.

17th Century Glasgow

- **New Glasgow, Quebec**
Founded in 1675 when a Scottish family came to Quebec and purchased a seigneurie, a riverfront farm. It existed as a village for 325 years until the year 2000, when it was amalgamated into nearby Sainte-Sophie, Quebec.

Newest

- **Glasgow, Ontario, Canada**
Distance from Glasgow: 5260 km (3156 miles)
Founded in 1930 by immigrants after WWI, Glasgow, Ontario is home to 1095 people (2020).

Largest

- **Glasgow, California**
Distance from Glasgow: 8026 km (4987 miles)
With a population of 25,000 (2022), this Glasgow is the second-largest in the world. At 400 km (250 miles) from Hollywood, it is becoming a haven for celebrities.

Smallest

- **Glasgow, Pennsylvania**
Distance from Glasgow: 5576 km (3465 miles)
Glasgow, Pennsylvania, in Beaver County, was founded in 1854 by Scottish immigrants. It is often called Smith's Ferry by locals, due to its regular ferryboat service. Its population is 71 (2020).

Most Authentic "Glasgow" outside Scotland

- **Glasgow, West Virginia**
Distance from Glasgow: 5824 km (3619 miles)
Glasgow, WV was settled by a large number of Scottish immigrants who came particularly from the Strathclyde area of Glasgow, Scotland. Founded in the early 20th Century, it was incorporated in 1920. Its population is 920 (2020).

Glasgow in South America

- **Glasgow, Suriname**
Distance from Glasgow: 7242 km (4500 miles)
Glasgow, Suriname (formerly Dutch Guiana) is a seaport built on polders during the British occupation of Dutch Guiana from 1796 to 1831. Scottish immigrants founded the town of Glasgow in 1830, where they grew coffee and cotton on land reclaimed from the Caribbean Sea. Glasgow's population is 771 (2020).

Highest Altitude

- **Mount Glasgow, Rocky Mountains, Alberta, Canada**
Distance from Glasgow: 6552 km (4071 miles)
Mount Glasgow rises 2935 m (9629 feet) above sea level, near the town of Kananaskis, Alberta. Climbing routes are open from June to September with an access pass.

Glasgow In Name Only

These Glasgows obtained their names in ways other than from Scottish immigrants.

- **Glasgow, Missouri, USA**
Founded 1836, population 1087 (2020)
 Named after its founder, James Glasgow, a local merchant.
- **Glasgow, Montana, USA**
Founded 1887, population 3250 (2020)
 Founder James Hill chose to name his new railway town in an unusual way; he put on a blindfold and

spun a globe to pick the name. When he stopped the globe, his finger rested on Glasgow, Scotland.

- **Glasgow, Oregon, USA**
Founded 1890, population 920 (2022)
 Founded by three real estate speculators from the Pacific Coal and Transportation Company who, on choosing the location, remarked that it reminded them of Glasgow, Scotland.
- **Glasgow, Virginia, USA**
Founded 1823, population 1109 (2021)
 Named after three brothers, Robert, Joseph, and Joshua Glasgow, the town is on the scenic Appalachian Trail. ■

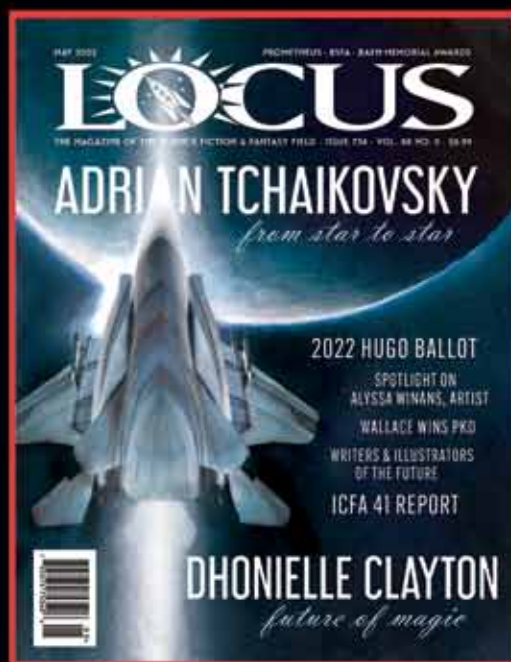

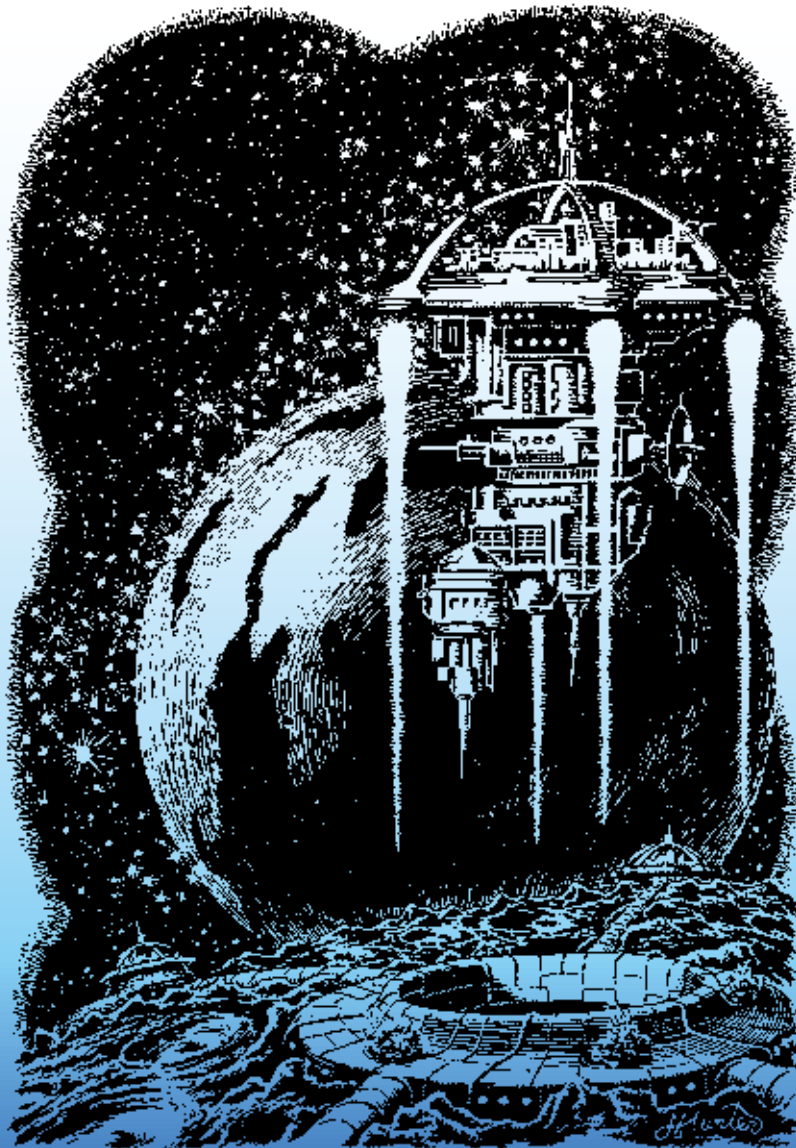

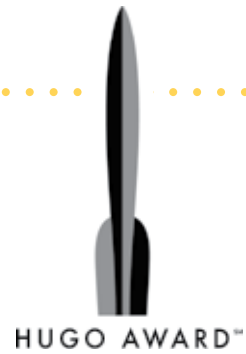
The Hugo Awards

In 1953, the World Science Fiction Convention created the Hugo Awards, named for Hugo Gernsback, honoring the best work in the genre. After a year's hiatus, the awards became an annual tradition, whose presentation is a highlight of every Worldcon. On eight previous occasions, Worldcons have presented retrospective Hugo Awards, filling in some of the blank spaces in SF's honors. Seven years are still eligible for Retro Hugos.

The Hugos are unique among genre awards in that they are decided by a vote of the Worldcon membership—fans. The categories vary from time to time, and each convention committee chooses its own distinctive trophy base, but two things are a constant: the rocket is fundamentally the original design by Ben Jason and Jack McKnight, and the honor is considered the height of science fictional achievement.

The World Science Fiction Society constitution gives Worldcons the opportunity to award Hugos for a year 50, 75, or 100 years in the past, provided that year was 1939 or later and that no previous Worldcon has awarded retrospective Hugo Awards for that year.

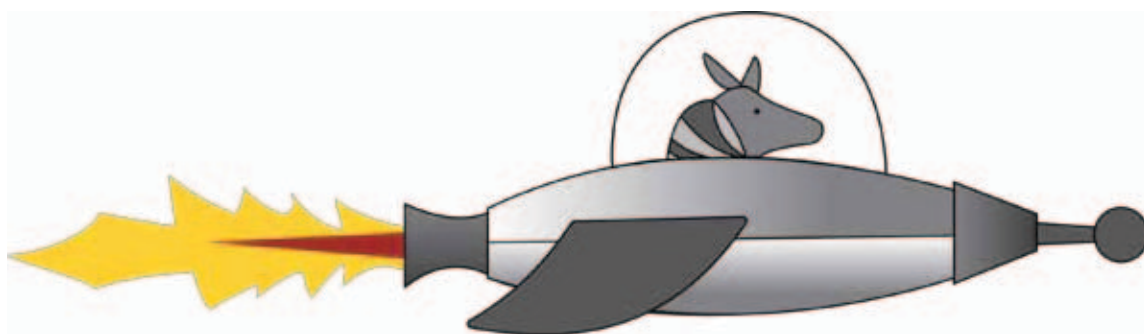

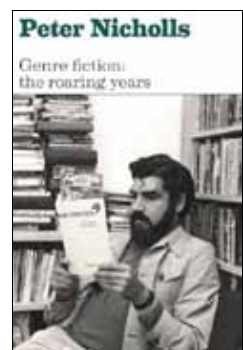

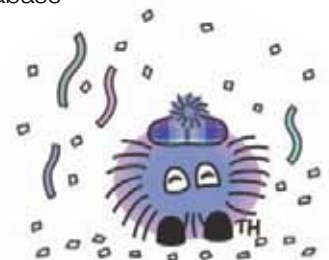

Notes on the Long List Of Worldcons

GENERAL NOTES

Number Year Name

We have normally listed a convention by the least confusing version of its name. Most often the first name is preferred but if a convention has a name that is also followed by a name that is more commonly known (e.g., Noreascon1 was known as the 1985 Worldcon), we use the more commonly known name.

Guests

Custom in designating Guests of Honor has varied greatly, with some conventions giving specific titles (Fan, Pro, Australia, US, Artist, etc.) and some simply call them all Guests of Honor. We have used specific labels where they existed. In general we do not note spelling issues like Honor/Honour.

The Toastmaster is not a Guest of Honor, though some conventions give the Toastmaster equal billing with the Guests. To confuse matters further, in a few cases a Guest was also designated as Toastmaster. In a few instances the Toastmaster was given a title other than Toastmaster such as Master of Ceremonies. All toastmasters and MCs we are aware of are listed in the notes. We have tried to note the names of the people who were.

Site

Under Site we have listed:

All facilities which have a non-trivial convention function

Theme including room hotel

Any other facilities which have accounted for 25% or more of the sleeping rooms.

Chairman

Who chaired a particular Worldcon is sometimes less clear than one might expect. Our policy in constructing this list is to be as accurate as possible without being misleading. We have attempted to follow the convention's official record (where it exists) supplemented by other contemporary records. In all cases where we are aware of ambiguity, we have included notes. When multiple people with Chairman-like titles exist (including Co-Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Associate Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and Deputy Assistant Co-Vice Chairman) we list only the actual top manager at the time of the convention in the main list, and all other people who were in line management positions with titles including the word fragment "chair" in the notes (i.e., all line managers with titles matching *[cC]hair*). When the title is co-Chairman and it appears that both were functional top managers, both are included in the Long List. People in support positions (non-line management positions) with Chair-like titles (e.g., Chairman's Staff or Assistant to the Chairman) are not listed. This list does not include bid leadership only leadership after the bid was won. Where we found ambiguity, we have documented it.

Additionally, we have attempted to document cases where there was a disconnect between the person holding the title of Chairman and the person(s) who were the actual top manager(s) of the convention.

Attendance

Where available, this column records two numbers: how many paying members actually attended the Worldcon and how many total members there were.

The attendance includes all paid admissions including one-days. (One-day admissions are usually not technically members of WSFS, but we do count them for the purpose of computing total attendance. A one-day admission counts as one attendee.) It excludes freebies who did not participate in the convention (e.g., contractors), unpaid children, paid attending members who did not attend, and all supporting members, but it does include free memberships given to people who did participate in the convention (e.g. guests of honor).

Total members includes everyone who paid for a membership or admission whether full attending, one-day, child, or supporting, plus the Guests of Honor and other free memberships given to people participating in the convention. It does not include freebies who did not participate in the convention (e.g., contractors).

The available data is very incomplete and imprecise and many of these numbers are probably substantially in error. We have noted cases where we know the numbers to be doubtful. About 99% of the numbers ending in 00 are estimates. The numbers are of the form aaaa/mmmm, where the first number is the attendance and the second the membership. When only one is known, the other is left blank (e.g., /2345 means an unknown attendance and 2345 total members). When only a single number is presented, we don't know if it is attendance or total members, though, historically, it seems most often to be attendance.

Convention Notes

1939 – Nycon I

The 1939 Worldcon did not have a name, but simply called itself World Science Fiction Convention. It has subsequently been called Nycon I and The 1939 Worldcon.

The convention was controlled by a so-called Ruling Triumvirate whose other members were William S. Sykora and James V. Taurasi.

1940 – Chicon I

Chicon I was run by a triumvirate. Mark Reinsberg held the title of chairman, with Erle Korshak (secretary) and Bob Tucker (treasurer) as equal partners. Korshak presided over the opening day of the con, when Reinsberg fell ill.

1947 – Philcon I

L. Jerome Stanton was Toastmaster.

1949 – Cinvention

Don Ford carried out the duties of Chairman, but was officially Secretary-Treasurer; Charles R. Tanner had the honorary title of Chairman.

Ted Carnell, the Fan Guest of Honor, was also toastmaster with the title Entertainment Master of Ceremonies. He was brought to North America by the Big Pond Fund.

1950Nor WesCon

Donald Da yr replaced Jack de Courcy as Chairman after the latter's resignation.

Theodore Sturgeon was the toastmaster and had the title Entertainment Master for the ceremonies.

1952F ASFiC

The ASFiC stood for the 25th Anniversary Science Fiction Convention; it was sponsored by known science fictionists and subsequent Conventions counted it as such.

This was probably the largest Worldcon to date. The membership numbers were confused due to the fact that here being a reported 1750 registered hosts (people who came without paying). The fee of \$8.70 paid attending members seems to be accurate; with the host staff here would be perhaps 1050 people at the convention. The 300 number for supporting Members is probably pretty accurate, as it is based on several fairly contemporary reports.

195341t hW worldcon

Officially known as the 11th Worldcon, it was sponsored by known science fictionists. The toastmaster was James A. Williams, science fictionist and author. Tom Clareson, PhD was Vice-Chairman.

Isaac Asimov was toastmaster.

1954S FCon

Though SFCon and Westercon shared the hotel and chairs, Westercon was held on Friday, September 3rd, with Jack Williams as the host, while Worldcon was held Saturday-Monday, September 4-6, with John Campbell, Jr., as the host. Robert Bloch was toastmaster.

1955Cle vention

The identity of the Special Mystery Guest was not revealed (event not known) until the first night of the convention. The Program Book noted that Mr. Bloch [the toastmaster] will make the presentation of the Achievement Awards and identify the Mystery Guest.

Anthony Boucher was toastmaster.

1956NY ConII

Officially known as the NY WORCON but not known as a report at the time. The fans would have been disappointed that it had been NYCon I since.

Robert Bloch was toastmaster.

1957L onconI

Loncon sponsored the Los Angeles Convention but referred to the convention as the 15th World Science Fiction Convention.

1958S olacon

Combined with the West Coast Science Fantasy Conference (Westercon), sharing the guests of Honor and Chairmen. Solacon was physically in Los Angeles, but by a verbal proclamation technically in Soledad, California, to fulfill the obligation of Soledad #58.

Anthony Boucher was toastmaster.

1959 – Detention

John Berry, the Fan GoH, was brought to North America by a special fan fund.

Isaac Asimov had been listed as the Toastmaster in all promotional material prior to the convention. At the convention the program book added "...with the assistance of Robert Bloch who acted as Asimov's foil at the banquet."

1960 – Pittcon

Ray Smith was Vice Chairman. The Program Book lists a non-con program day on Friday, 2 Sept.

Isaac Asimov was Toastmaster.

1961 – Seacon

Harlan Ellison was Toastmaster.

1962 – Chicon III

Wilson Tucker was Toastmaster.

For a long time the stated attendance figure was 550 members, but this seems to have been the result of a series of ancient typos when setting successive program books. The convention proceedings and other contemporary documentation supports 730 members at the con and 830 members overall.

1963 – Discon I

Isaac Asimov was Toastmaster.

1964 – Pacificon II

Combined with West Coast Science Fantasy Conference (Westercon), sharing Guests of Honor and Chairmen. Pacificon II was held in Oakland, CA, which was not the same city (LA, 1946) where Pacificon I was held.

Anthony Boucher was Toastmaster.

1965 – Loncon II

Tom Boardman was Toastmaster.

1966 – Tricon

Officially jointly hosted by Cleveland, Detroit, and Cincinnati (hence Tricon). The question of who chaired the convention is complicated. The Tricon program book lists Cleveland's Ben Jason as Chairman and Detroit's Howard DeVore and Cincinnati's Lou Tabakow as Associate Chairmen, but included all three in the Long List as did NyCon 3 the following year. People involved with the convention confirm that it was run by the three of them working jointly, so they are being treated as co-Chairmen here.

Isaac Asimov was Toastmaster.

1967 – NyCon 3

The convention's name was written as NyCon 3 at the convention, but somehow subsequently got changed to NyCon III in versions of the Long List, perhaps echoing NYCon II. Harlan Ellison was Toastmaster.

1968 – Baycon

Combined with West Coast Science Fantasy Conference (Westercon), sharing Guests of Honor and Chairmen.

Robert Silverberg was Toastmaster.

The Long List *(continued)*

The long-used attendance figure estimated from the Baycon Post-Con Report total registered attendance just short of 1300... with 2-300 non-registered dwalk-ins at various times.

1969 **St. Louiscon**

Eddie Jones, the TAFF (Trans Atlantic Fan Fund) winner, replaced Ted White, who withdrew as a guest of honor to ramatize the TAFF winner.

Harlan Ellison was Toastmaster.

1970 **Heicon**

Heicon had decided prior to the convention to select the TAFF winner as the guest of honor. This was subsequently the 1970 TAFF election was settled shortly after.

Heicon is called itself Heicon 70 International.

John Brunner was Toastmaster.

1971 **Northeastcon**

Robert Silverberg was Toastmaster.

1972 **L.A. Con**

Robert Bloch was Toastmaster.

1973 **Forcon II**

Lester Del Rey was Toastmaster.

1974 **Discon II**

Jay and Alice Haldeman were co-Chairmen until the spring of 1974 when circumstances forced them to move out of Washington. Ron Bounds took over as de facto Chairman until Jay returned for the convention. At the convention, Jay and Ron functioned as co-chairmen. The Discon II program book continued to list Jay and Alice as co-Chairmen, and included a welcome from Jay (co-Chairman) and Ron (vice-Chairman).

Andrew J. Offutt was Toastmaster.

1975 **Aussiecon One**

Fan Guest of Honor Donald Tuck did not attend the convention. (Fans had to go to his home in Tasmania to meet him.)

John Bagnall was Toastmaster.

1976 **MidAmericaCon**

Theme membership totals are from chairman Ken Keller who reported that many members announced during the convention were grossly wrong because of the C&VB slip and registration id number errors and records until afterwards. The previous Long List number of 2800 was an estimate made by a computer from the faulty attendance figures.

Wilson Tucker was Toastmaster.

1977 **SunCon**

SunCon was scheduled in 1977, a group of well-known con-runners who announced their withdrawal from the arching for an ideal site. The selected site was the Sheaton Hotel in Orlando, Florida, which was not available for the month of the convention.

The hotel was selected after a renegotiation of the convention contract and SunCon was moved to the Fontainebleau Hotel in Miami Beach.

According to Chairman Don Lundry, his wife Grace Lundry functioned as his co-Chairman; however, convention publications listed Don solely.

In 2003 Don Lundry provided a revised attendance figure of 3240, replacing the number of 2500 reported in publications at the time and subsequently in previous versions of this list. It is possible that this is a total membership and not attendance.

Robert Silverberg was Toastmaster.

1978 – **IguanaCon II**

This was the first IguanaCon, but was called IguanaCon II because of a previous hoax.

Greg Brown was the initial Chairman but was later replaced by Tim Kyger. After the convention, Gary Farber was recognized as having fulfilled the function of Vice-Chairman.

Josef Nesvadba was announced as the European GoH for IguanaCon. He could not get travel papers and did not attend. He was not listed as a guest in PR3. In the program book he was listed on the main GoH page, but was not listed in IguanaCon's own entry in the Long List. Finally, he was not listed in IguanaCon's PR 5, which came out in 1980 and provided a detailed history of what went on, who resigned and who replaced who.

F. M. Busby was Toastmaster.

1979 – **Seacon 79**

Seacon 79 was held in Brighton, England, which was not the same city (Seattle, 1961) where Seacon I was held.

Bob Shaw was Toastmaster.

1980 – **Northeastcon Two**

Robert Silverberg was Toastmaster.

1981 – **Denvention Two**

Ed Bryant was Toastmaster.

1982 – **Chicon IV**

Larry Smith and Bob Hillis were Vice-Chairmen.

Marta Randall was Toastmaster.

1983 – **Constellation**

Jack L. Chalker was Toastmaster.

1984 – **LAcon II**

Like South Gate, Anaheim is part of the greater Los Angeles area. The Toastmaster and MC positions were essentially equivalent, with Robert Bloch (Toastmaster) officiating at the Hugo Ceremony and Jerry Pournelle (Master of Ceremonies) at the Guest of Honor Speeches and Other Awards Ceremony.

This was the largest Worldcon to date.

1985 – **Aussiecon II**

David Grigg replaced John Foyster, who resigned for family reasons, as Chairman.

1986 – **ConFederation**

Bob Shaw was Toastmaster.

The Long List *(continued)*

Initially Vince Docherty was Chairman with Colin Harris and Paul Treadaway as Vice Chairmen. Subsequently, Harris moved to Co-Chairman, and Treadaway moved to Deputy Chairman.

Initially, Sally Woehrlé and Bobbie DuFault were Co-Chairmen, but DuFault died two weeks after the bid was won.

TheV ice-Chairmenw ereG lennG lazer, PierrePe ttinger and MikeWi lmoth.

2016 – MidAmeriCon II

The Guests of Honor were listed with no designation as to type.

Pat Cadigan was Toastmaster.

Initially Diane Lacey, Ruth Lichtwardt, and Jeff Orth were Co-Chairmen. In February 2016, Lichtwardt became sole Chairman and Lacey was appointed Vice-Chairman.

2017 – Worldcon 75

Initially Jukka Halme, Saija Aro, and Crystal Huff co-chaired the convention. Aro resigned in May 2016 and Huff resigned in November 2016, leaving Halme as the sole chairman.

Attendance and Total Members both include 2346 Attending memberships sold at about half price the majority of which reflected a discount given to first time Worldcon attendees.

There were 1876 one-day memberships. As is normal, they were counted as attendances.

Karo Leikomaa and Colette H. Fozard were Vice-Chairmen.

2018 – Worldcon 76 in San Jose

Bob Wilkins and Edgar Pangborn were dead when selected and were designated g Host of Honor and Ghost of Honor, respectively.

John Picacio was also Toastmaster.

2020 – CoNZealand

George R. R. Martin will be Toastmaster.

CoNZealand was forced by the Covid-19 pandemic to forego holding an in-person convention and ran entirely (with one unimportant exception) online. (The exception was a proforma WSFS Business meeting which was held in Wellington and lasted only long enough to validate 2022 Site Selection and pass all pending business on to DC3.) The physical sites which had been slated to be used were the TSB Arena and Shed 6, the Michael Fowler Center, the West Plaza Hotel, and the Intercontinental Hotel, all in Wellington, NZ.

CNZ used three online platforms with independent registrations for different aspects of the con. The number adopted for CNZ's attendance is the highest of those three registration numbers. No numbers are available for how many fans actually participated.

2021 – DisCon III

Initially, Colette Fozard and William Lawhorn were co-chairs. Fozard resigned in January 2021.

In June, Lawhorn resigned and at the start of July, Mary Robinette Kowal was appointed to replace him.

DisCon III removed Toni Weiskopf, Publisher of Baen Books, as Guest of Honor in March 2021 following controversy over content posted on the Baen's Bar Internet forum with which Baen Publications was closely associated.

Initially, the convention facility was the Marriott Wardman Park. The Omni Shoreham was subsequently added. In March 2020 due to Covid-19, the Wardman Park closed and later declared bankruptcy. In April 2021, the convention announced a shift to new dates of December 15-19, 2021 and a move to the Omni Shoreham as its sole facility.

Constitution

of the World Science Fiction Society as of October 23, 2023

NOTE: Material in **red** has been deleted from the current Constitution; and material in **blue** is newly added.

Article 1 Name, Objectives, Membership, and Organization

Section 1.1: Name.

The name of this organization shall be the World Science Fiction Society, hereinafter referred to as WSFS or the Society.

Section 1.2: Objectives.

WSFS is a non-profit literary society whose functions are:

- (1) To host the recipient of the annual Hugo Awards (Science Fiction Achievement Awards).
- (2) To host the Worldcon and World Science Fiction Conventions (hereinafter referred to as Worldcons).
- (3) To attend Worldcons.
- (4) To host the National American Science Fiction Conventions (hereinafter referred to as NASFICs).
- (5) To perform such other activities as may be necessary or incidental to the above purposes.

Section 1.3: Restrictions.

No part of the Society shall be used for the promotion of any political campaign for public office. Should the Society dissolve, its assets shall be distributed by the current Worldcon Committee or the appropriate authority, exclusively for charitable purposes. In this connection, reference to the Society includes the Mark Protection Committee and all other agencies of the Society without convention bidding or operating committees.

Section 1.4: Membership.

The membership of WSFS shall consist of all people who have paid membership dues to the Committee of the current Worldcon.

Section 1.5: Memberships.

1.5.1: Each Worldcon shall offer WSFS memberships and attending supplements.

1.5.2: The recipient of the WSFS membership for a Worldcon include the right to receive the following generally distributed publications: WSFS membership handbook, natural persons may not be transferred, except that, in case of death of a natural person holding a WSFS membership, it may be transferred to the estate of the decedent.

1.5.3: The recipient of the WSFS membership shall have the right to attend the Worldcon and to be included in the rights of WSFS

members plus the right of general attendance at said Worldcon and at the WSFS Business Meeting held thereat.

1.5.4: Members of WSFS who cast a site-selection ballot with the required fee shall be supporting members of the selected Worldcon.

1.5.5: Voters have the right to purchase an attending supplement in the selected Worldcon within ninety (90) days of its selection, for an additional fee set by its committee. This fee must not exceed four (4) times the site-selection fee and must not exceed the price of an attending supplement for new members.

1.5.6: The Worldcon Committee shall make provision for persons to become supporting members for no more than one hundred and twenty-five percent (125%) of the site-selection fee, or such higher amount as has been approved by the Business Meeting, until a cutoff date no earlier than ninety (90) days before their Worldcon.

1.5.7: Other memberships and fees shall be at the discretion of the Worldcon Committee.

1.5.8: No convention committee shall sell a membership that includes any WSFS voting rights for less than the cost of the Supporting Membership required by Article 4 in the selection of that convention.

1.5.9: No convention committee shall sell a membership that is available to persons of the age of majority at the time of the convention (as defined by the laws of the country and other jurisdictions where the convention is being held), that allows attendance and full participation for the entire duration of the convention and that does not include all WSFS voting rights. Should no law of the country and other jurisdictions where the convention is being held define an age of majority, the convention shall consider all persons 18 years of age or older as being of age of majority.

1.5.10: No convention shall terminate the sale of supporting memberships prior to the close of site selection.

Section 1.6: Authority.

Authority and responsibility for all matters concerning the Worldcon, except those reserved herein to WSFS, shall rest with the Worldcon Committee, which shall act in its own name and not in that of WSFS.

Section 1.7: The Mark Protection Committee.

1.7.1: There shall be a Mark Protection Committee of WSFS, which shall be responsible for registration and protection of the marks used by or under the authority of WSFS.

1.7.2: The Mark Protection Committee shall submit to the Business Meeting at each Worldcon a report of its activities since the previous Worldcon, including a statement of income and expense.

1.7.3: The Mark Protection Committee shall hold a meeting at each Worldcon after the end of the Business Meeting, at a time and place announced at the Business Meeting.

1.7.4: The Mark Protection Committee shall determine and elect its two officers.

Section 1.8: Membership of the Mark Protection Committee.

1.8.1: The Mark Protection Committee shall consist of:

(1) One (1) member appointed on the advice of the Board of Directors of the World Science Fiction Convention and one (1) member appointed by the World Science Fiction Convention, and

(2) One (1) member appointed on the advice of the Board of Directors of the World Science Fiction Convention and one (1) member appointed by the World Science Fiction Convention, and

(3) Nine (9) members elected by the World Science Fiction Convention, staggered three-year terms by the Business Meeting.

1.8.2: Newly elected members shall take their oaths, and the terms of office shall be determined by the Board of Directors of the World Science Fiction Convention.

1.8.3: If vacancies occur in the Committee, they shall be filled by the Business Meeting, and until they are temporarily filled by the Convention.

Article 2 Powers and Duties of Worldcon Committees

Section 2.1: Duties.

Each Worldcon Committee shall, in accordance with this Constitution, provide for

(1) administering the Hugo Awards,

(2) administering the Worldcon or NASFiC selection process, and

(3) holding the World Science Fiction Convention.

Section 2.2: Marks.

Every Worldcon or NASFiC Committee shall include a notice in each of its publications that clearly acknowledges the service marks of the World Science Fiction Convention and the Worldcon Committee with the correct form of notice.

Section 2.3: Official Representative.

Each Worldcon or NASFiC Committee shall designate an official representative to answer questions about the Worldcon.

Section 2.4: Distribution of Rules.

The current Worldcon or NASFiC Committee shall publish the World Science Fiction Convention and the Worldcon or NASFiC Constitution and Rules, together with an explanation of proposed changes proposed to it, and ratify the Worldcon or NASFiC Committee's distribution of the World Science Fiction Convention and the Worldcon or NASFiC members' attendance at the Worldcon upon registration.

Section 2.5: Bid Presentations.

Each Worldcon or NASFiC Committee shall provide a reasonable opportunity for the Worldcon or NASFiC to make presentations.

Section 2.6: Incapacity of Committees.

With respect to the Worldcon or NASFiC, here

are at least two selected current or future Worldcon Committees at all times. If one of these should be unable to perform its duties, the other selected current or future Worldcon Committee shall determine what action to take, by consulting the Business Meeting or by mail poll of WSFS if there is sufficient time, or by decision of the Committee if there is not sufficient time. Where a site and Committee are chosen by a Business Meeting or Worldcon Committee pursuant to this section, they are not restricted by exclusion zone or other qualifications.

Section 2.7: Membership Pass-along.

Within ninety (90) days after a Worldcon, the administering Committee shall, except where prohibited by local law, forward to the Committee of the next Worldcon its best information as to the names and contact information of all of its Worldcon members who have given permission for that data transfer and only for the purposes for which permission to use that data transfer and only for the purposes for which permission to use that data was given.

Section 2.8: Financial Openness.

Any member of WSFS shall have the right, under reasonable conditions, to examine the financial records and books of account of the current Worldcon or NASFiC Committee, all future selected Worldcon or NASFiC Committees, the two immediately preceding Worldcon Committees, and the Committees of any NASFiCs held in the previous two years.

Section 2.9: Financial Reports.

2.9.1: Each future selected Worldcon or NASFiC Committee shall submit an annual financial report, including a statement of income and expenses, to each WSFS Business Meeting after the Committee's selection.

2.9.2: Each Worldcon or NASFiC Committee shall submit a report on its cumulative surplus/loss at the next Business Meeting after its convention.

2.9.3: Each Worldcon or NASFiC Committee should dispose of surplus funds remaining after accounts are settled for its convention for the benefit of WSFS as a whole.

2.9.4: In the event of a surplus, the Worldcon or NASFiC Committee, or any alternative organizational entity established to oversee and disburse that surplus, shall file annual financial reports regarding the disbursement of that surplus at each year's Business Meeting, until the surplus is totally expended or an amount equal to the original surplus has been disbursed.

2.9.5: All financial reports shall include the convention's name, mailing address and other contact information, including the name of the person certifying and submitting the report and, if applicable, the name of the convention's parent organization, its tax-exempt status, the location of incorporation, its address, website, email and other contact information, and the names and titles of its current officers.

Article 3 – Hugo Awards

Section 3.1: Introduction.

Selection of the Hugo Awards shall be made as provided in this Article.

Section 3.2: General.

3.2.1: Unless otherwise specified, the Awards are given for works that have been published in a print or electronic form for the first time during the previous calendar year.

3.2.2: Awards may be given to individuals or organizations that have received sufficient nominations to appear on the final award ballot.

3.2.3: Publications that are over due at the time of a dated periodical, take precedence over copyrighted materials.

3.2.4: Works appearing in a series are eligible as individual works, but these series authors are not eligible, except under subsection 3.3.5. However, a work appearing in a number of parts is eligible for the award in its individual part.

3.2.5: [An interactive work \(1\) a game or \(2\) a narrative or presentation in which characters interactively lay an integral component of the work to the reader, or \(3\) a work that is itself a non-trivial fashion, and \(3\) is not ephemeral, in the sense that the interactive element of the work is accessible to participants through published or available artifacts, and the work is not a ventriloquist's participation of specific members.](#)

3.2.6: In the event of a tie (3.3.1-3.3.6), an author may withdraw a nomination for work from consideration if the author elects to have a representative of what that author wrote.

3.2.7: The categories of Best Novel, Best Novella, Best Novelette, Short Story, and Best Series are defined as [non-interactive](#) works in which the text is primarily for communication, regardless of the publication medium, including but not limited to physical print, audiobook, and ebook.

3.2.8: The Worldcon Committee shall consider previews, promotional trailers, commercials, public service announcements, or other extraneous material when determining the length of a work. Run time is the primary factor in determining the length of a work. Run time is the primary factor in determining the length of a work.

3.2.9: The Worldcon Committee may allocate a story into a more appropriate category if it feels that it is necessary, provided that the length of the story is within twenty percent (20%) of the new category limits.

3.2.10: A work may be nominated for a category on the final Award ballot.

3.2.11: The Worldcon Committee may allocate a dramatic presentation to a more appropriate category if it feels that it is necessary, provided that the length of the work is within twenty percent (20%) of the new category boundary.

3.2.12: A Professional Publication is one which meets at least one of the following criteria:

(1) it is provided to a large audience of the general public or persons,

(2) it was published by a professional publisher or provided at least a quarter of the audience for a professional publisher or owner.

3.2.13: The Worldcon Committee shall be responsible for all matters concerning the Awards.

Section 3.3: Categories.

3.3.1: Best Novel. A science fiction or fantasy story of forty thousand (40,000) words or more.

3.3.2: Best Novella. A science fiction or fantasy story of between seventeen thousand five hundred (17,500) and forty thousand (40,000) words.

3.3.3: Best Novelette. A science fiction or fantasy story of between seven thousand five hundred (7,500) and seventeen thousand five hundred (17,500) words.

3.3.4: Best Short Story. A science fiction or fantasy story of less than seven thousand five hundred (7,500) words.

3.3.5: Best Series. A multi-installment science fiction or fantasy story, unified by elements such as plot, characters, setting, and presentation, appearing in at least three (3) installments consisting in total of at least 240,000 words by the close of the previous calendar year, at least one (1) installment of which was published in the previous calendar year, and which has not previously won under subsection 3.3.5.

3.3.5.1: Previous losing finalists in the Best Series category shall be eligible only upon the publication of at least two (2) additional installments consisting in total of at least 240,000 words after they qualified for their last appearance on the final ballot and by the close of the previous calendar year.

3.3.6: Best Graphic Story or Comic. Any [non-interactive](#) science fiction or fantasy story told in graphic form appearing for the first time in the previous calendar year.

3.3.7: Best Related Work. Any work related to the field of science fiction, fantasy, or fandom, appearing for the first time during the previous calendar year or which has been substantially modified during the previous calendar year, and which is either non-fiction or, if fictional, is noteworthy primarily for aspects other than the fictional text, and which is not eligible in any other category.

3.3.8: Best Dramatic Presentation, Long Form. Any non-interactive theatrical feature or other production, with a complete running time of more than 90 minutes, in any medium of dramatized science fiction, fantasy or related subjects that has been publicly presented for the first time in its present dramatic form during the previous calendar year.

3.3.9: Best Dramatic Presentation, Short Form. Any non-interactive television program or other production, with a complete running time of 90 minutes or less, in any medium of dramatized science fiction, fantasy or related subjects that has been publicly presented for the first time in its present dramatic form during the previous calendar year.

3.3.10: Best Game or Interactive Work. [Any interactive work or interactive substantial modification of a work in the fields of science fiction, fantasy, or related subjects, released to the public in the previous year and available for public participation in the interactive elements of the work in that year.](#)

[Provided that unless the above section is re-ratified by the 2028 Business Meeting, this Section shall be repealed; and](#)

[Provided further that the question of re-ratification shall automatically be placed on the agenda of the 2028 Business Meeting.](#)

3.3.11: Best Edited or Short Form. The editor of the first four (4) anthologies, collections, or magazine issues (or their equivalent) of the year (primarily devoted to science fiction and/or fantasy, a tie to be broken in favor of the publisher) who has previously published in the previous calendar year.

3.3.12: Best Edited or Long Form. The editor of the first four (4) novel-length works primarily devoted to science fiction and/or fantasy published in the previous calendar year that do not qualify for section 3.3.11.

3.3.13: Best Professional Artist. An illustrator whose work has appeared in a professional publication in the field of science fiction or fantasy during the previous calendar year.

3.3.14: Best Serialized Work. Any generally available non-professional periodical publication devoted to science fiction or fantasy, or related subjects which has lost of the previous calendar year as published for (4) or more issues (or their equivalent) of the year (a tie to be broken in favor of the publisher), which does not qualify for section 3.3.11 or 3.3.12. The following criteria:

(1) the publisher's name on the cover of the publication,

(2) the generally available name of the publisher,

3.3.15: Best Serialized Work. Any generally available non-professional periodical publication devoted to science fiction, fantasy, or related subjects which has lost of the previous calendar year as published for (4) or more issues (or their equivalent) of the year (a tie to be broken in favor of the publisher), that does not qualify for section 3.3.11 or 3.3.12. The following criteria:

(1) the publisher's name on the cover of the publication,

(2) the generally available name of the publisher.

3.3.16: Best Serialized Work. Any generally available non-professional audio or video periodical devoted to science fiction, fantasy, or related subjects which has lost of the previous calendar year as released for (4) or more episodes, a tie to be broken in favor of the publisher, that does not qualify for section 3.3.11 or 3.3.12. The following criteria:

3.3.17: Best Serialized Work. Any person whose work has appeared in serialized form in a generally available electronic medium during the previous calendar year.

3.3.18: Best Serialized Work. An artist or cartoonist whose work has appeared through publication in serialized form in a generally available electronic medium, including the internet, in a non-linear or on-demand format, or in another setting not requiring a fixed set of pages (resolution) during the previous calendar year.

3.3.19: Lodestar Award for Best Young Adult Book. The Lodestar Award for Best Young Adult Book is given for a book published in the year for which it is awarded in the field of science fiction or fantasy appearing for the first time during the previous calendar year, with such exceptions as are listed in Section 3.4.

3.3.20: Additional Category. Not more than one special category may be created by the current Worldcon Committee with nomination and voting to be the same as for the permanent categories. The Worldcon Committee is not required to create any such category; such action by a Worldcon Committee should be under exceptional circumstances only; and the special category created by one Worldcon Committee shall not be binding on following Committees. Awards created under this paragraph shall be considered to be Hugo Awards.

Section 3.4: Extended Eligibility.

3.4.1: A work originally appearing in a language other than English shall also be eligible for the year in which it is first issued in English translation.

3.4.2: Works originally published outside the United States of America and first published in the United States of America in the previous calendar year shall also be eligible for Hugo Awards.

3.4.2.1: For finalists in the Series category that have previously appeared on the ballot for Best Series, any installments published in English in a year prior to that previous appearance, regardless of country of publication, shall be considered to be part of the Series' previous eligibility, and will not count toward the re-eligibility requirements for the current year.

3.4.3: In the event that a potential Hugo Award nominee receives extremely limited distribution in the year of its first publication or presentation, its eligibility may be extended for an additional year by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the intervening Business Meeting of WSFS.

Section 3.5: Name and Design.

The Hugo Award shall continue to be standardized on the rocket ship design of Jack McKnight and Ben Jason as refined by Peter Weston. Each Worldcon Committee may select its own choice of base design. The name (Hugo Award) and the design shall not be extended to any other award.

Section 3.6: No Award.

At the discretion of an individual Worldcon Committee, if the lack of nominations or final votes in a specific category shows a marked lack of interest in that category on the part of the voters, the Award in that category shall be canceled for that year.

Section 3.7: Nominations.

3.7.1: The Worldcon Committee shall conduct a poll to select the finalists for the Award voting. Each member of the administering Worldcon or the immediately preceding Worldcon as of January 31 of the current calendar year shall be allowed to make up to five (5) equally weighted nominations in every category.

3.7.2: The Committee shall include with each nomination ballot a copy of Article 3 of the WSFS Constitution and any applicable extensions of eligibility under Section 3.4.

3.7.3: Nominations shall be solicited only for the Hugo Awards, the Astounding Award for Best New Writer, and the Lodestar Award for Best Young Adult Book.

Section 3.8: Tallying of Nominations.

3.8.1: Except as provided below, the final Award ballots shall list in each category the six eligible nominees

receiving the nominations and determined by the process described in section 3.9.

3.8.2: The Worldcon Committee shall determine the eligibility of nominees and assign them to the proper category of works nominated in that category.

3.8.3: If a nominee is not selected for a category, only the version which received the most nominations shall appear.

3.8.4: Any nominations for a category shall be disregarded.

3.8.5: If a nominee appears in a category, only one nomination shall be counted in that category.

3.8.6: If hereafter a work is found to be a reasonable effort to copy or imitate the work of another author or authors, or to be a derivative work, or to be a work of plagiarism, or to be a work of fraud, or to be a work of libel, or to be a work of obscenity, or to be a work of violence, or to be a work of any other nature which is deemed to be in violation of the rules of the Worldcon Committee, the Committee shall make reasonable efforts to identify the work and its author or authors and to remove it from the final ballot. The Worldcon Committee shall make reasonable efforts to identify the work and its author or authors and to remove it from the final ballot. For the purpose of this exclusion, works withdrawn for the purpose of this exclusion, works withdrawn shall be ignored.

3.8.7: The Committee shall make every effort to ensure that the individual ballot for each category is the default category of the nominee's membership (5) nominations in that category.

3.8.8: If a work is eligible in more than one category, and if the work receives sufficient nominations to appear in more than one category, the Worldcon Committee shall determine which category the work shall appear, based on the category in which it received the most nominations.

3.8.9: If a work receives a nomination in its default category, and if the Committee located the work under its authority under section 3.2.9 or subsection 3.2.11, the Committee shall count the nomination even if the member already has a membership (5) nominations in that category.

Section 3.9: Finalist Selection Process

3.9.1: For each category, the finalist selection process shall be conducted as follows:

(1) Calculation Phase: First, the total number of nominations (the number of ballots in which the nominee appears) for each category shall be determined. Next, a single ballot shall be assigned to each nominee in that category. The ballot shall be divided equally among the remaining nominees in that category. Finally, a ballot for each nominee in that category shall be totaled for each nominee in that category. The work with the highest total number of nominations shall be selected for the Selection and Elimination Phases.

(2) Selection Phase: The work with the highest total number of nominations shall be selected for the Elimination Phase. (See subsection 3.9.3 for ties.)

(3) Elimination Phase: The nominee with the fewest

number of nominations shall be eliminated and removed from all ballots for the Calculation Phase of all subsequent rounds. (See subsection 3.9.3 for ties.)

3.9.2: The phases described in subsection 3.9.1 are repeated in order for each category until the number of finalists specified in subsection 3.8.1 remain. If elimination would reduce the number of finalists to fewer than the number specified in subsection 3.8.1, then instead no nominees will be eliminated during that round, and all remaining nominees shall appear on the final ballot, extending it if necessary.

3.9.3: Ties shall be handled as described below:

(1) During the Selection Phase, if two or more nominees are tied for the lowest point total, all such nominees shall be selected for the Elimination Phase.

(2) During the Selection Phase, if one nominee has the lowest point total and two or more nominees are tied for the second-lowest point total, then all such nominees shall be selected for the Elimination Phase.

(3) During the Elimination Phase, if two or more nominees are tied for the fewest number of nominations, the nominee with the lowest point total at that round shall be eliminated.

(4) During the Elimination Phase, if two or more nominees are tied for both fewest number of nominations and lowest point total, then all such nominees tied at that round shall be eliminated.

3.9.4: After the initial Award ballot is generated, if any finalist(s) are removed for any reason, they will be replaced by other works in reverse order of elimination.

Section 3.10: Notification and Acceptance.

3.10.1: Worldcon Committees shall use reasonable efforts to notify the finalists, or in the case of deceased or incapacitated persons, their heirs, assigns, or legal guardians, in each category prior to the release of such information. Each person notified shall be asked at that time to either accept or decline the nomination. If the person notified declines nomination, that finalist(s) shall not appear on the final ballot. The procedure for replacement of such finalist(s) is described in subsection 3.9.4.

3.10.2: In the Best Professional Artist category, the acceptance should include citations of at least three (3) works first published in the eligible year.

3.10.3: Each finalist in the categories of Best Fanzine and Best Semiprozine shall be required to provide information confirming that they meet the qualifications of their category.

Section 3.11: Voting.

3.11.1: Final Award voting shall be by balloting in advance of the Worldcon. Postal mail shall always be acceptable. Only WSFS members may vote. Final Award ballots shall include name, signature, address, and membership-number spaces to be filled in by the voter; however, if the voter does not have their membership number, it may be supplied by the Hugo Administrator or their designated staff member.

3.11.2: Final Award ballots shall list only the Hugo Awards, the John W. Campbell Award for Best New Writer, and the Lodestar Award for Best Young Adult Book.

3.11.3: No award shall be made in any category of Hugo Award not held in all.

3.11.4: The Committee shall, on the first of the following categories, one or more books, anthologies, or magazines in which the finalists appeared (including the book publisher's magazine issued at least once).

3.11.5: Voters shall indicate the order of their preference for the finalists in each category.

Section 3.12: Tallying of Votes.

3.12.1: In each category, tallying shall be as described in Section 6.4. No award shall be made to a finalist. If all remaining finalists are tied, no tie-breaking shall be done and the finalist(s) excluding No Award shall be declared joint winners.

~~**3.12.2:** No award shall be given where the number of ballots cast for a specific category (excluding those cast for No Award in first place) is less than twenty-five percent (25%) of the total number of ballots received.~~

3.12.2: No award shall be given to a candidate for the purpose of Section 6.5.

3.12.3: The complete number of votes, including all preliminary ballots for first, second, and third places, shall be made public by the Worldcon Committee within ninety (90) days after the Worldcon. During the same period, the results for each category (or all categories if there are fewer than ten) shall be published.

Section 3.13: Exclusions.

No member of the current Worldcon Committee or any publications closely connected with the member of the Committee shall be eligible for an award. However, should the Committee delegate authority under its Article to a Subcommittee whose decisions are irrevocable by the Worldcon Committee, then these exclusions shall apply to members of the Subcommittee only.

Section 3.14: Retrospective Hugo Awards.

3.14.1: A Worldcon held in any year shall have an exact multiple of five years after the year in which the Hugo Awards were awarded. Multiple nominations and elections for retrospective awards shall be held for the year with procedures as for the current Hugo Awards, provided that year was 1939 or later and that no previous Worldcon has awarded retrospective awards for that year.

3.14.2: In any year in which a Worldcon Committee or WSF, S, or retrospective Hugo Awards shall be distinguished and noted with the year in which such retrospective awards were revoked.

Article 4 Future Worldcon Election

Section 4.1: Voting.

4.1.1: WSF shall choose the national Committee of the Worldcon to be held in the year from that of the current Worldcon.

4.1.2: Voting shall be by written ballot cast either by mail or at the current Worldcon with tallying as described in Section 6.4.

4.1.3: The current Worldcon Committee shall administer the voting, collect the advance membership fees, and turn over those funds to the winning Committee before the end of the current Worldcon.

4.1.4: The site-selection voting totals shall be announced at the Business Meeting and published in the first or second Progress Report of the winning Committee, with the by-mail and at-convention votes distinguished.

Section 4.2: Voter Eligibility.

4.2.1: Voting shall be limited to WSF members who have purchased at least a supporting membership in the Worldcon whose site is being selected.

4.2.2: The supporting membership rate shall be set by unanimous agreement of the current Worldcon Committee and all bidding committees who have filed before the ballot deadline. If agreement is not reached, the default fee shall be the median (middle value) of the US dollar fees used in the previous three (3) Worldcon site selections.

Section 4.3: Non-Natural Persons.

Corporations, associations, and other non-human or artificial entities may cast ballots, but only for No Preference. Guest memberships may only cast No Preference ballots. Memberships transferred to individual natural persons may cast preferential ballots, provided that the transfer is accepted by the administering convention.

Section 4.4: Ballots.

4.4.1: Site-selection ballots shall include name, signature, address, and membership-number spaces. The ballot should be filled in by the voter; however, if the voter does not have their membership number, it may be supplied by the Site Selection Administrator or their designated staff member. Each site-selection ballot shall list the options No Preference and one of the Above and provide for write-in votes, after the bidders and with equal prominence. The supporting membership rate shall be listed on all site-selection ballots.

4.4.2: Worldcons may, with the agreement of all active bids, choose to offer any electronic signature means legal in the seated Worldcon's home jurisdiction.

4.4.3: Worldcons must offer the option to receive a paper site selection ballot regardless of that member's selection for other publications. Should they choose to include other material (such as an addressed envelope and stamp or International Reply Coupon), they may charge a reasonable fee for such materials.

Section 4.5: Tallying.

4.5.1: The name and address information shall be separated from the ballots and the ballots counted only at the Worldcon. Each bidding committee should provide at least two (2) tellers. Each bidding committee may make a record of the name and address of every voter.

4.5.2: A ballot voted with first or only choice for No Preference shall be ignored for site selection. A ballot voted with lower than first choice for No Preference shall be ignored if all higher choices on the ballot have been eliminated in preferential tallying.

4.5.3: No Preference shall be treated as a bid for tallying and shall be the run-off candidate for the purposes of Section 6.5.

4.5.4: All ballots shall be initially tallied by their first preferences, even if cast for a bid that the administering Committee has ruled ineligible. If no eligible bid achieves a majority on the first round of tallying, then on the second round all ballots for ineligible bids shall be redistributed to their first eligible choices, and tallying shall proceed according to Section 6.4.

4.5.5: If one of the above wins, or if two or more bids are tied for first place, then the duty of site selection shall devolve to the Business Meeting of the current Worldcon. If the Business Meeting is unable to decide by the end of the Worldcon, the Committee or the following Worldcon shall make the selection without undue delay.

4.5.6: When the site selection committee receives a Business Meeting of the Worldcon Committee following a win by one of the above, they shall be restricted by exclusion of other qualifications.

4.5.7: When the site selection committee receives a Business Meeting of the Worldcon Committee following a tie in tallying, they must select one of the tied bids.

Section 4.6: Bid Eligibility.

4.6.1: To be eligible for site selection, a bidding committee must file the following documents with the Committee that will administer the voting:

(1) a notification of intent to bid;

(2) a detailed description of the proposed site facilities, such as a conditional contract letter of agreement;

(3) the resumes of the Worldcon Committee members, including a specification of their executive offices and conditions and procedures for the selection and replacement of such officers.

4.6.2: The bidding committee must supply two copies of these documents to the member of WSFS who requests.

4.6.3: For a bid to be allowed to be placed, the bidding committee must file the documents specified above at least 180 days prior to the official opening of the administering convention.

4.6.4: To be eligible as a write-in, the bidding committee must file the documents specified above by the close of the voting.

4.6.5: If no bids meet the qualifications, the selection shall proceed to the next of the above.

Section 4.7: Site Eligibility.

As it shall be eligible for site selection, the site shall be within 500 miles of the Worldcon site, which selection occurs.

Section 4.8: NASFiC.

If the selected Worldcon is in North America, there shall be a NASFiC in North America. The selection of the NASFiC shall be by the Business Meeting of the Worldcon, except as provided below or elsewhere in this Constitution:

4.8.1: Voting shall be by written ballot administered by the following year's Worldcon, if there is one, with

or by the following year's NASFiC, if there is one, with ballots cast at the administering convention or by mail, and with only members of the administering convention allowed to vote.

4.8.2: NASFiC Committees shall make all reasonable efforts to avoid conflicts with Worldcon dates.

4.8.3: The proposed NASFiC supporting membership rate can be set by unanimous agreement of the administering Committee and all bidding committees who have filed before the ballot deadline. If agreement is not reached, the default fee shall be the median (middle value) of the US dollar fees used in the previous three (3) Worldcon site selections.

4.8.4: If none of the above wins, or if no eligible bid files by the deadline, then no NASFiC shall be held, and any supporting membership payments collected for the NASFiC site selection shall be refunded by the administering convention without undue delay.

4.8.5: In the case the administering convention is a NASFiC, it shall hold a Business Meeting to receive the results of the site selection voting and to handle any other business pertaining directly, and only, to the selection of the future NASFiC convention. This meeting shall have no other powers or duties.

4.8.6: For the purposes of this Constitution, North America is defined as: Canada, the United States of America (including Hawaii, Alaska, and the District of Columbia), Mexico, Central America, the islands of the Caribbean, St. Pierre et Miquelon, Bermuda, and the Bahamas.

Article 5 – Powers of the Business Meeting

Section 5.1: WSFS Business Meetings.

5.1.1: Business Meetings of WSFS shall be held at advertised times at each Worldcon.

5.1.2: The current Worldcon Committee shall provide the Presiding Officer and Staff for each Meeting.

5.1.3: Standing Rules for the Governance of the Business Meeting and related activities may be adopted or amended by a majority vote at any Business Meeting. Amendments to Standing Rules shall take effect at the close of the Worldcon where they are adopted; this rule may be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote.

5.1.4: Meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of (in descending order of precedence) the WSFS Constitution; the Standing Rules; such other rules as may be published in advance by the current Committee (which rules may be suspended by the Business Meeting by the same procedure as a Standing Rule); the customs and usages of WSFS (including the resolutions and rulings of continuing effect); and the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

5.1.5: The quorum for the Business Meeting shall be twelve members of the Society physically present.

5.1.6: Deadline for Submission of New Business. The deadline for submission of non-privileged new business and committee reports to the Business Meeting shall be thirty (30) days before the first Preliminary Meeting. Proposed agenda items may be withdrawn by the consent of all proposing members at any time up to fourteen (14)

days before published deadline or submitted by business. All into force withdrawn business must be made available to membership. The Presiding Officer may accept otherwise qualified motions and report submitted after the deadline, but unless motion shall initially be placed at the meeting agenda. The resolution may be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote.

Section 5.2: Continuation of Committees.

Except as otherwise provided in this Constitution, any committee or other position created by Business Meeting shall appear at the meeting following Business Meeting had previously continued.

Section 5.3: Constitutional Pass-along.

Within sixty (60) days after the Worldcon, the Business Meeting shall affirm the changes to the Constitution and Standing Rules, and shall submit waiting ratification, to the Worldcon Committee.

Article 6: Constitution

Section 6.1: Conduct.

The conduct of the fair science fiction business determined by this Constitution together with the ratified amendments hereto and Standing Rules shall be Business Meeting shall adopt or to wngovernance.

Section 6.2: Natural Persons.

In all matters arising under this Constitution, only natural persons may introduce business, nominate, or vote, except as specifically provided otherwise in this Constitution. No person may cast more than one vote on any election. This shall not be interpreted to prohibit delivery of ballots to their eligible voters.

Section 6.3: Electronic Voting.

Nothing in this Constitution shall be interpreted to prohibit conducting Hugo Awards nominating and voting and Site Selection voting by electronic means, except that conducting Site Selection by electronic means shall require the unanimous agreement of the current Worldcon committee and all bidding committees who have filed before the ballot deadline. Valid paper ballots delivered by any means shall always be acceptable. This section shall not be interpreted to require that such elections be conducted electronically, nor shall it be interpreted to allow remote participation or proxy voting at the Business Meeting.

Section 6.4: Tallying of Votes.

Votes shall first be tallied by the voter's first choice. If no majority is obtained, the candidate who places last in the initial tallying shall be eliminated and the ballots listing it as first choice shall be redistributed to the eligible voters of those ballots second choice. This process shall be repeated until a majority-vote is obtained. If two or more candidates are tied for elimination during this process, the candidate that received the fewest first-place votes shall be eliminated. If there is a tie, all tied candidates shall be eliminated together.

Section 6.5: Run-off.

After a tentative winner is determined, then unless the run-off candidate shall be the sole winner, the following additional test shall be made. If the number of ballots preferring the run-off candidate to the tentative winner is greater than the number of ballots preferring the tentative winner to the run-off candidate, then the run-off candidate shall be declared the winner of the election.

Section 6.6: Amendment.

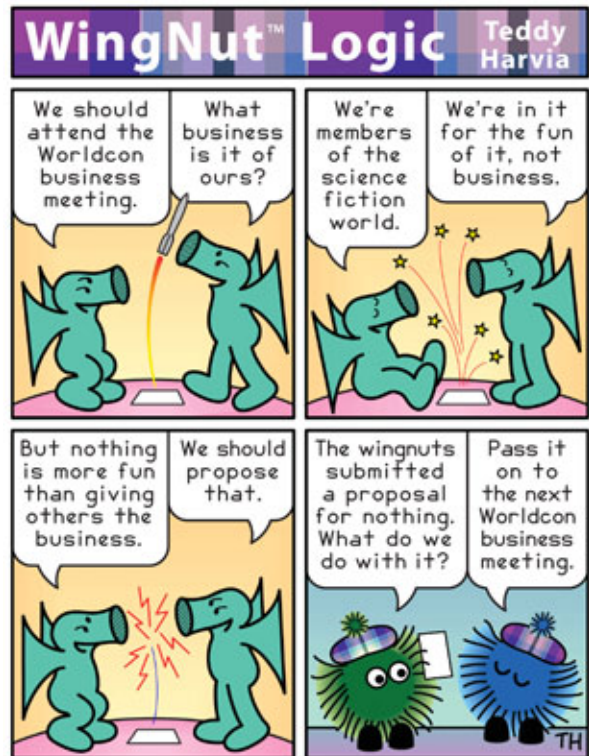
The WSFS Constitution may be amended by a motion passed by a simple majority at any Business Meeting but only to the extent that such motion is ratified by a simple majority at the Business Meeting of the subsequent Worldcon.

Section 6.7: Commencement.

Any change to the Constitution of WSFS shall take effect at the end of the Worldcon at which such change is ratified, except that no change imposing additional costs or financial obligations upon Worldcon Committees shall be binding upon any Committee already selected at the time when it takes effect.

Standing Rules

for the Governance of the World Science Fiction Society Business Meeting

Group 1: Meetings

Rule 1.1: Meeting and Session. The Annual Meeting of the World Science Fiction Society shall consist of one or more Preliminary Business Meetings and one or more Main Business Meetings. The first meeting shall be designated as the Preliminary Business Meeting. All meetings at Worldcon (preliminary, main, or otherwise) shall be considered as sessions as defined in the Parliamentary Authority (see Section 5.1 of the WSFS Constitution), regardless of whether such gatherings are called meetings or sessions.

Rule 1.2: Preliminary Business Meeting(s). The Preliminary Business Meeting may not directly elect, pass, or ratify amendments to the Constitution; however, all motions and amendments are in order for otherwise allowed. The Preliminary Business Meeting may refer a Constitutional amendment to a committee unless the committee instructions are to report to the Main Business Meeting. The Preliminary Business Meeting may postpone consideration of a Constitutional amendment pending ratification beyond the next Preliminary Business Meeting. The Preliminary Business Meeting may take a Constitutional amendment pending ratification. The Preliminary Business Meeting may consider any business not expressly forbidden by the Standing Rules or expressly reserved to the Main Business Meeting.

Rule 1.3: Main Business Meeting(s). The Main Business Meeting may elect, pass, or ratify amendments to the Constitution. One Main Meeting shall be a closed session designated as the Site-Selection Meeting, where Site-Selection business shall be held in private.

Rule 1.4: Scheduling of Meetings. The first Main Meeting shall be scheduled no less than eighteen (18) hours after the conclusion of the last Preliminary Meeting. Meetings shall be scheduled to begin before 10:00 or after 13:00 local time.

Rule 1.5: Smoking. Regardless of whether smoking is allowed in the place where the Business Meeting is held, the Business Meeting shall be a non-smoking environment. The Presiding Officers shall notify participants of these restrictions outside of the location of the Business Meeting at the beginning of each meeting.

Rule 1.6: Recording of Sessions. The Presiding Officer may arrange for the recording of meetings in any medium and for the distribution of such recordings. Individual members may record meetings at their own discretion, subject to the will of the assembly as authorized by rule 5.10.

Rule 1.7: Bilingual Debate. The official language of the Business Meeting is English. The Business Meeting may conduct bilingual discussions and debate in both English and the official language of the current Worldcon committee country, provided that simultaneous interpretation is available.

Group 2: New Business

Rule 2.1: No Award. In the event that the total number of valid ballots cast for a specific category (excluding those cast for No Award in First Place) is fewer than ten percent (10%) of the total number of final Award ballots received in a non-Retrospective Hugo Award vote in two years out of three successive years, an amendment effecting the removal of that category from the list of enumerated Hugo Award categories shall be automatically placed on the agenda for the next Worldcon Business Meeting.

Rule 2.2: Requirements for Submission of New Business. Two hundred (200) identical, legible copies of all proposals for non-privileged new business shall be submitted to the Presiding Officer before the deadline in Section 5.1.6 of the WSFS Constitution, unless such proposals are distributed to the attendees at the Worldcon by the Worldcon Committee. All proposals must be legibly signed by a maker and at least one seconder.

Rule 2.3: Interpretation of Motions. The Presiding Officer shall reject as out of order any proposal or motion that is obviously illegal or hopelessly incoherent. In the absence of the maker of a motion or instructions to the contrary, the Presiding Officer shall be free to interpret the meaning of any motion.

Rule 2.4: Short Title. Any item of new business considered by the Business Meeting shall contain a short title.

Rule 2.5: Discussion Items. [Any committee report to the Business Meeting, including Business Meeting, WSFS, and Worldcon committee reports, may include a motion that a topic be discussed by the Business Meeting to provide feedback to the committee. Such discussion may include non-binding straw polls. If not specified in the motion, the default discussion time is 6 minutes, and the discussion item is scheduled as an item of New Business.](#)

Group 3: Debate Time Limits

Rule 3.1: Main Motions: The Presiding Officer shall designate the default debate time for main motions. If an objection is raised to this default time, the Business Meeting shall vote on it without debate. If that designated time is defeated, the Business Meeting shall, by majority vote, set the initial debate time limit for any motion to any positive even number of minutes up to 30.

Rule 3.2: Allotment of Time. If a question is divided, the time limits applicable to the question before it was divided shall apply to each portion of the divided question. Debate time shall be allotted equally to each side of a question. Time spent on points of order or other neutral matters arising from a motion shall be divided equally and charged to each side.

Rule 3.5: Minimum Substantive Debate. If t hed ebate timee xpriresb eforee ithero rb othsi deso ft heq uestion haveha da no pportunityf orsub stantived ebate,a ny side thatha sno tha dsuc ha no pportunitysha llha vet wo (2) minutest ob euse dso lelyf ort hep urposeo fsub stantive debate.

Group 4: Official Papers

Rule 4.1: Indicating Revisions. The Business Meeting staff shall clearly indicate all changes (including deletions) fromt hep reviousye ar sve rsionwhe nt heyp rovide the Constitutiona ndSt andingRul esf orp ublicationp rior to thef ollowingW orldcon.H owever,t hef ailure to indicate suchc hangessha llno ta ffectt hevalidityo ft he documents.

Rule 4.2: Corrections. Any correctiono f fact to the Minuteso rt ot heC onstitutiono rSt andingRul esa s publishedsho uldb e rough tt ot hea ttentiono ft he Secretaryo ft heBusi nessM eetingi nq uestiona nd of the nexta vailableBusi nessM eetinga sso ona st heya re discovered.

Rule 4.3: Numbers, Titles, References, and Technical Corrections. Rule 4.4: Availability of BMM Materials. Group 5: Variations of Rules

Rule 5.1: Non-standard Parliamentary Authority. If a WorldconC ommitteea doptsf ort he governance of the

Business Meeting a parliamentary authority other than that specified in the Constitution, the Committee must in timely fashion publish information about how to obtain copies of the authority in question.

Rule 5.2: Constitutional and Standing Rule Amendments. Motions to Amend the Constitution, to Ratify a Constitutional Amendment, and to Amend the Standing Rules shall be considered ordinary main motions, except as otherwise provided in the Standing Rules or Constitution. An object to consideration shall not be in order against ratification of a constitutional amendment.

Rule 5.3: Postpone Indefinitely. The motion to Postpone Indefinitely shall not be allowed at the Main Business Meeting, but shall be allowed at the Preliminary Business Meeting. This motion shall have four (4) minutes of debate time and shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote for adoption.

Rule 5.4: Amend; Ratification Amendments. Motions to amend a constitutional amendment awaiting ratification must be submitted in advance by the deadline in Section 5.1.6 of the WSFS Constitution. This rule can be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote.

Rule 5.5: Amend; Secondary Amendments. Secondary amendments (amendments to amendments) are not allowed except when the primary amendment is to substitute.

Rule 5.6: Previous Question. A person speaking to a motion may not immediately offer a motion to close debate. The motion for the Previous Question (also known as the motion to close debate, call the question, and vote now) shall not be in order when there is less than one minute of debate time remaining, nor when either or both sides of the debate have yet to speak to a question. Before voting on the motion for the Previous Question, the Presiding Officer shall, without debate, ask for a show of hands of those persons who still wish to speak to the matter under consideration.

Rule 5.7: Lay on the Table. The motion to Lay on the Table shall require a two-thirds (2/3) vote for adoption.

Rule 5.8: Adjournment. The incidental main motion to adjourn sine die shall not be in order until all Special and General Orders have been discharged.

Rule 5.9: Suspension of Rules. Rules protecting the rights of absentees, including this rule, may not be suspended.

Rule 5.10: Start/Stop Recording. If the meeting is being recorded, a motion to Stop Recording or to Start Recording is a privileged motion and shall be handled in the same way as a motion to Enter or Leave Executive Session.

Rule 5.11: Objection to Consideration. An Objection to Consideration shall require a three-fourths (3/4) vote to kill a motion without debate.

Rule 5.12: Committee of the Whole. The Committee of the Whole shall have the right by a two-thirds vote to amend its duration without seeking permission from the Business Meeting by way of a motion to extend debate.

Group 6: Mark Protection Committee Elections

Rule 6.1: Nominations. Nominations for election to the Mark Protection Committee shall be allowed from the floor to each Preliminary Business Meeting. To be listed on the ballot, a nominee must submit to the Secretary of the Business Meeting a nomination consent form to the nominator. The deadline for submission of nominations shall be set by the Secretary.

Rule 6.2: Elections. Election of the Mark Protection Committee shall be by special order of business at a designated Main Business Meeting. Voting shall be by written referendum or ballot. If necessary, a runoff election may be held. Candidates who do not submit written consent to nomination of the Presiding Officer before the close of balloting shall be ineligible. The list of candidates shall be first published in the program and then in the minutes of the Business Meeting. Candidates shall be listed in alphabetical order of last name. If two candidates have the same last name, they shall be listed in order of first name. Candidates shall be listed in order of last name, first name, and middle initial. Candidates shall be listed in order of last name, first name, and middle initial. Candidates shall be listed in order of last name, first name, and middle initial. Group 7: Miscellaneous

Rule 7.1: Question Time. During the Site-Selection Meeting, fifteen (15) minutes of program time shall be allocated to each of the Worldcon committees. During the first five (5) minutes, each committee may make up to three presentations. The remaining time shall be allocated for questions about that committee's Worldcon. Questions may be submitted in writing to the appropriate committee chair or by email to the person who submitted the question. The person may ask a second question. Questions are limited to fifteen (15) seconds and responses to two (2) minutes. If time permits at the Site-Selection Meeting, committees bidding for the right to host the next Worldcon whose selection will take place in the next calendar year shall be allowed five (5) minutes of program time to make up to three presentations. The time limit shall be determined by majority vote.

Rule 7.2: Dilatory Actions; Misuse of Inquiries. The sole purpose for a point of information or parliamentary inquiry is to obtain clarification of the opinion of the Presiding Officer or the correct procedure to follow. The Presiding Officer shall treat as dilatory any attempt to circumvent the rules of debate under the guise of a point of information, parliamentary inquiry, or other request.

Rule 7.3: Counted Vote. The Presiding Officer shall take a counted vote on the request for an amendment (10%) of those members attending the meeting.

Rule 7.4: Calling Business Forward. Motion to alter the Constitution or amendments waiting ratification may be carried forward to a later date by a majority vote.

Rule 7.5: Continuing Resolutions. Resolutions of continuing effect (continuing resolutions) may be repealed or amended by majority vote of subsequent Business Meetings without notice, and shall be automatically repealed or amended by applicable amendments to the Constitution or Standing Rules or by conflicting resolutions passed by subsequent Business Meetings.

Rule 7.6: Committees. All committees are authorized to organize themselves in any lawful manner and to adopt rules for the conduct of their business, which may include conducting balloting by mail and limiting debate, subject to any contrary provisions of the Constitution, the Standing Rules, or instructions given to the committee by the Business Meeting.

Rule 7.7: Nitpicking and Flyspecking Committee. The Business Meeting shall appoint a Nitpicking and Flyspecking Committee. The Committee shall: (1) Maintain the list of Rulings and Resolutions of Continuing Effect (2) Codify the Customs and Usages of WSFS and of the Business Meeting.

Rule 7.8: Worldcon Runners Guide Editorial Committee. The Business Meeting shall appoint a Worldcon Runners Guide Editorial Committee. The Committee shall maintain the Worldcon Runners Guide, which shall contain a compilation of the best practices in use among those who run Worldcons.

Rule 7.9: Proxy and Remote Voting. Only WSFS members physically present at the Business Meeting shall be recognized for purposes of debate, or may move, second, or vote on motions on the floor of the meeting. Proxy voting is not permitted.

World Science Fiction Society Business Passed on from Chengdu 2023 to Glasgow 2024

Item 1: Short Title: Marks Authorization

Moved, to [add](#) and [delete](#) material in Article 10 of the WSFS Constitution as follows:

Article 2 – Powers and Duties of ~~Worldcon~~ [Convention](#) Committees

Section 2.2: Marks.

[2.2.1: Selected Convention Committees are authorized to use the WSFS Mark of the World Science Fiction Society and its customarily used mark for the Convention. The Mark Protection Committee may provide guidance.](#)

[2.2.2: Every ~~Worldcon~~ \[World Science Fiction Convention\]\(#\) Committee shall include no fewer than one member who is a publication specialist or a knowledgeable member of the Society. The Mark Protection Committee shall supply each ~~Worldcon~~ \[selected Convention\]\(#\) Committee with the correct form for use.](#)

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: This amendment to the WSFS Constitution strengthens and clarifies the traditional and essential but limited ability of Worldcon and NSFiCs to use the WSFS mark by documenting it in the Constitution. It also provides a new editorial wording for consistency.

Item 2: Short Title: Business Meeting Contingencies

Moved, to amend the WSFS Constitution by [adding](#) text as follows:

Section 1.8: Membership of the Mark Protection Committee.

1.8.1: The Mark Protection Committee shall consist of:

(1) One (1) member appointed by the Board of Directors of each of the selected Worldcon Committees and each of the World Science Fiction Convention Committees,

(2) One (1) member appointed by the Board of Directors of each of the selected NSFiC Committees and one member of the NSFiC Executive Committee for each of the World Science Fiction Conventions, and

(3) Nine (9) members elected by the members of the staggered three-year terms by the Business Meeting. [However, if such an election is not held due to a Business Meeting no being held, the Board of Directors may, for any other reason, temporarily suspend the Mark Protection Committee membership until the next Worldcon year.](#)

Section 5.1: WSFS Business Meetings.

5.1.1: Business Meetings of the WSFS shall be advertised in advance of the Worldcon. [However, if such a Business Meeting is not held, the Board of Directors may, for any other reason, temporarily suspend the Business Meeting until the next subsequent Business Meeting.](#)

[ratification vote on any constitutional amendment shall be similarly postponed.](#)

5.1.5: The quorum for the Business Meeting shall be twelve members of the Society physically present. [A Business Meeting that is not quorate may nevertheless receive reports, but the ratification vote on any constitutional amendment shall be postponed until the next subsequent Business Meeting.](#)

Section 6.6: Amendment.

The WSFS Constitution may be amended by a motion passed by a simple majority at any Business Meeting but only to the extent that such motion is ratified by a simple majority at the Business Meeting of the [next](#) subsequent Worldcon [at which ratification is not postponed as per subsection 5.1.1 or 5.1.5.](#)

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: There have been years in which a Worldcon was not held due to war. There have been years in which a Worldcon was delayed or almost cancelled by pestilence. There have been years in which it was difficult to obtain a quorum for the Business Meeting. Yet the Constitution makes no provisions for such contingencies. While providing for all possible contingencies is impossible, this amendment to the Constitution provides for the contingencies discussed above.

Item 3: Short Title: Consistent Change

Moved, to amend the WSFS Constitution by [adding](#) and [deleting](#) text as follows:

Section 1.5: Memberships.

1.5.4: Members of WSFS who cast a site-selection ballot with the required fee shall be [supporting WSFS](#) members [of](#) [for](#) the selected Worldcon.

1.5.6: The Worldcon Committee shall make provision for persons to become [supporting WSFS](#) members for no more than one hundred and twenty-five percent (125%) of the site-selection fee, or such higher amount as has been approved by the Business Meeting, until a cutoff date no earlier than ninety (90) days before their Worldcon.

1.5.8: No convention committee shall sell a membership that includes any WSFS voting rights for less than the cost of the [supporting WSFS](#) Membership required by Article 4 in the selection of that convention.

1.5.10: No convention shall terminate the sale of [supporting WSFS](#) memberships prior to the close of site selection.

Section 4.2: Voter Eligibility.

4.2.1: Voting shall be limited to WSFS members [of the administering convention](#) who have purchased at least a

supporting WSFS membership not held Worldcon whose site is [and committee](#) being selected.

4.2.2: The supporting WSFS membership rate [for the convention being selected](#) shall be set by unanimous agreement of the current Worldcon Committee and all bidding committees who have filed before the ballot deadline. If agreement is not reached, the default fee shall be the median (middle value) of the US dollar fees used in the previous three (3) Worldcon site selections.

Section 4.4: Ballots.

4.4.1: Site-selection ballots shall include name, signature, address, and membership-number spaces. The ballot should be filled in by the voter; however, if the voter does not have their membership number, it may be supplied by the Site Selection Administrator or their designated staff member. Each site-selection ballot shall list the options None of the Above and No Preference and provide for write-in votes, after the bidders and with equal prominence. The supporting WSFS membership rate shall be listed on all site-selection ballots.

Section 4.8: NASFiC

4.8.3: The proposed NASFiC ~~supporting membership rate~~ [advance voting fee](#) and set by unanimous agreement of the administering Committee and all bidding committees who have filed before the ballot deadline. If agreement is not reached, the default fee shall be the median (middle value) of the US dollar fees used in the previous three (3) Worldcon site selections.

4.8.4: If none of the Above wins, or if no eligible bid files by the deadline, then no NASFiC shall be held, and any ~~supporting membership payments~~ [advance voting fees](#) collected for the NASFiC site selections shall be refunded by the administering convention without undue delay.

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: The previous supporting membership and attending membership structure has been changed to WSFS membership and attending membership in the key portions of the WSFS Constitution, but the parts were not updated consistently. These changes make the Constitution consistent.

Item 4: Short Title: Convention Time Bracket

Moved, to [add](#) material in Article IV of the WSFS Constitution by [adding](#) the following new section to the end of Article V:

[4.XT Time Bracket. A selected convention must be held between 20 June and 20 December, and should consult with its successor if after 30 September of the year for which it is selected, unless some deviation from this is authorized under Section 2.6 of the Constitution.](#)

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: The earliest Worldcon was held July 4th weekend. The latest Worldcon has been held was Discon 3 which was held December 15th to December 19th. But the vast majority of Worldcons and NASFiCs have been held in August through early September. Looking at the record (and schedule of future Worldcons):

- 56 were Labor Day Weekend (the weekend before the first Monday in September).
- 21 were earlier but entirely within August.
- 4 were July 4th weekend (all very early in the series of Worldcons).
- 1 was on the July/August boundary.
- 1 was in October.
- 1 was in December.

The purpose of this amendment is to provide reasonable expectations and limits on the dates of a selected convention set so that a convention has adequate time to accomplish its required duties and will not impinge on the year of the following convention. The reference to Section 2.6 is to establish that a committee that cannot meet this requirement has failed under Section 2.6, and the provisions of that section apply.

Item 5: Short Title: Bid Committee Contactability

Moved, to [add](#) material in Article IV of the WSFS Constitution as follows:

Article IV Future Worldcon Selection

Section 4.4: Ballots.

4.4.x: [Site-selection ballots shall, with each bid qualifying to be on the ballot, include that bid's postal and email addresses.](#)

Section 4.6: Bid Eligibility.

4.6.1: To be eligible for site selection, a bidding committee must file the following documents with the Committee that will administer the voting:

- (1) an announcement of intent to bid [along with the name of the bid committee and its postal and email addresses](#);
- (2) adequate evidence of an agreement with its proposed site's facilities, such as a conditional contract or a letter of agreement;
- (3) the rules under which the Worldcon Committee will operate, including a specification of the term of office of their chief executive officer or officers and the conditions and procedures for the selection and replacement of such officer or officers.

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting or ratification in 2024.

Commentary: This amendment to the WSFS Constitution provides for improved ability to contact bid committees.

Item 6: Short Title: Ballot Completeness

Moved, to [add](#) material in Article IV of the WSFS Constitution as follows:

Article IV Future Worldcon Selection

Section 4.4: Ballots.

Site-selection ballots shall include name, signature, [postal](#) address, [email address](#), and membership-number spaces, and [may include a telephone number space](#). The ballot should be filled in by the voter; however, if the voter does not have their membership number, it may be supplied by the Site Selection Administrator or their

designated staff member. [Ballotso mittingna me, signature or postal address may only be counted as No Preference](#). Each selection ballot shall list the options in one of the above order of preference and provide a written invitation, a letterhead and the equal prominence. The supporting membership list shall be listed in the order of selection ballots.

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: The purposes of this amendment to the Constitution are to clarify and expand the provisions regarding the order of selection ballots and to clarify the effect of omitting a specific name from the list. This amendment is void if the confusion that occurred around the 2021 election is not resolved by the 2024 election. If ratified in 2024, the first selection ballot provisions will take effect on the date of the 2025 Worldcon.

Item 7: Short Title: Independent Films

Moved, to amend the WSFS Constitution by [adding](#) the following two clauses:

[3.3.X: Best Independent Short Film Award. Awarded to science fiction or fantasy productions presented in the short film format \(under 45 minutes\) for the first time in the previous calendar year. The film should NOT be funded by a major studio or distribution label/platform/Streamer. Films can be funded by national film/arts grants like the BFI or TeleCanada. The award should not include broadcast or streaming television series episodes.](#)

[3.3.X+1: Best Independent Feature Film Award. Awarded to science fiction or fantasy productions presented in the long film format \(over 61 minutes\) for the first time in the previous calendar year. The film should NOT be funded by a major studio or distribution label/platform/Streamer. Films can be funded by national film/arts grants like the BFI or TeleCanada.](#)

Provided that the text has been revised by the 2027 Business Meeting, the following changes shall be applied:

Provided that the text has been revised by the 2027 Business Meeting.

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: The Hugo Awards should encourage independent filmmakers in the science fiction/fantasy genre, as they often have a harder time exploring new and diverse perspectives, unconstrained by commercial considerations. This is the best way to ensure a diverse and vibrant industry. Independent science fiction/fantasy films are a great way to launch a new career for many aspiring directors, writers, actors, and producers.

Item 8: Short Title: Eligibility Criteria for Non-English Work

Moved, to amend the WSFS Constitution by [adding](#) a new clause after existing Section 3.2.8a as follows:

[3.2.X: The Worldcon committee can establish a conversion ratio between the word count in a specific language and the number of English words. Nomination categories for written works shall be determined based on the converted English word count.](#)

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: As the popularity of the Hugo Awards increases, more works aspire to become finalists. Therefore, the current Worldcon committee needs to perform language conversion for the finalist works to ensure fair classification in the written works categories. This approach can address differences in word counts between works in different languages and ensure that each work has an equal opportunity in the selection process.

Item 9: Short Title: Best Fancast Not Paying Compensation

Moved, to amend the WSFS Constitution by [adding](#) and [deleting](#) text as follows:

3.3.15: Best Fancast. Any generally available non-professional audio or video periodical devoted to science fiction, fantasy, or related subjects that by the close of the previous calendar year has released four (4) or more episodes, at least one (1) of which appeared in the previous calendar year, ~~and that does not qualify as a dramatic presentation.~~ [And that does not in the previous calendar year met neither of the following criteria:](#)

- (1) qualify as a dramatic presentation, [or](#)
- (2) [paid its contributors or staff monetarily.](#)

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: In the category of Best Fancast, there is no stipulation regarding whether compensation can be provided. According to the terms for Best Fanzine, it is suggested that no compensation be allowed for any program participant.

Item 10: Short Title: Language Requirement

Moved, to amend the WSFS Constitution as follows:

3.4.1: A work originally appearing in a language other than [English](#) [the main languages of the countries of the administering and prior year Worldcons](#) shall also be eligible for the year in which it is first issued in [English](#) translation [to a main language of the countries of the administering and prior year Worldcons.](#)

3.4.2: Works originally published outside the ~~United States of America~~ [countries of the administering and prior year Worldcons](#) and first published in the ~~United States of America~~ [countries of the administering and prior year Worldcons](#) in the previous calendar year shall also be eligible for Hugo Awards.

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: This amendment generalizes these language provisions in the Constitution so that they no longer reference English or the United States of America.

Item 11. Short Title: Convention Generalization

Moved, to amend the WSF Constitution as follows:

Replace all occurrences of Worldcon or NASFiC and all occurrences of Worldcon and NASFiC with selected convention.

Change Section 2.8 as follows:

Section 2.8: Financial Openness. Any member of WSFS shall have the right, under reasonable conditions, to examine the financial records and books of account of the current ~~Worldcon or NASFiC committee selected conventions,~~ all future selected ~~Worldcon or NASFiC Committees conventions,~~ ~~that will immediately precede Worldcon Committees, and the committees of any NASFiC she did not have~~ and all previous selected conventions ~~as set forth in the most recent two years.~~

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

Commentary: This change generalizes the Constitution so that it can accommodate the election of the NASFiC or the addition of an Asian Science Fiction Convention (ASFiC) or similar changes without further change.

Item 12. Short Title: Establishment of ASFiC

Moved, to amend the WSF Constitution as follows:

Add text of Section 1.2 point 4 as follows:

Section 1.2: (4) To choose the locations and Committees for the occasional North American Science Fiction Conventions (hereinafter referred to as NASFiCs) and Asia Science Fiction Conventions (hereinafter referred to as ASFiCs).

Add the section in Article IV as follows:

4.X: ASFiC. If the selected Worldcon site is not in Asia, there shall be an ASFiC in Asia that year. Selection of the ASFiC shall be by the identical procedure to the Worldcon selection except as provided below or elsewhere in this Constitution:

4.X.1: Voting shall be by written ballot administered by the following year's Worldcon, if there is no ASFiC in that year, or by the following year's ASFiC, if there is one, with ballots cast at the administering convention or by mail, and within the members of the administering convention allowed to vote.

4.X.2: ASFiC committees shall make all reasonable efforts to avoid conflicts with Worldcon dates.

4.X.3: The proposed ASFiC supporting membership rate can be set by unanimous agreement of the administering Committee and all bidding committees who have filed before the allotted deadline. If an agreement is not reached, the default shall be the median (middle value) of the fees used in the previous three (3) Worldcon site selections.

4.X.4: If none of the Above wins, or if no eligible bid files by the deadline, then no ASFiC shall be held, and any supporting membership payments collected for the ASFiC site selection shall be refunded by the administering convention without undue delay.

4.X.5: For the purposes of this Constitution, Asia is defined as the area bounded to the north by the Arctic Ocean, to the east by the Pacific Ocean, to the south by the Indian Ocean, and to the west by the Ural Mountains, the Ural River, the Caspian Sea, the Caucasus Mountains, the Black Sea, the Aegean Sea, the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea, and the Arabian Sea.

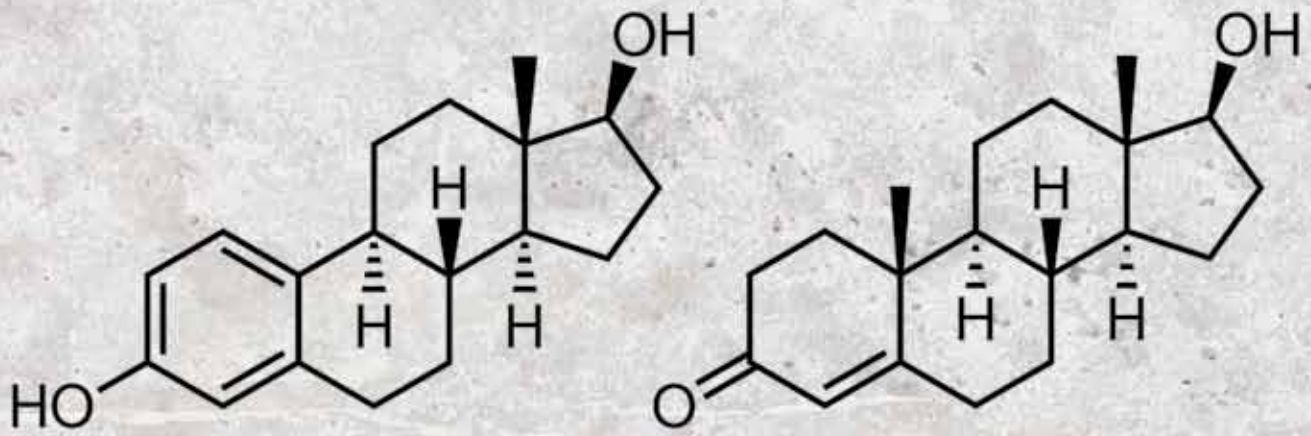
Provided that unless this amendment is re-ratified by the 2029 Business Meeting, the above changes shall be repealed effective with the end of the 2029 Worldcon but any previously selected ASFiC will remain an ASFiC; and

Provided further that the question of re-ratification shall automatically be placed on the agenda of the 2029 Business Meeting.

Forwarded by the 2023 WSFS Business Meeting for ratification in 2024.

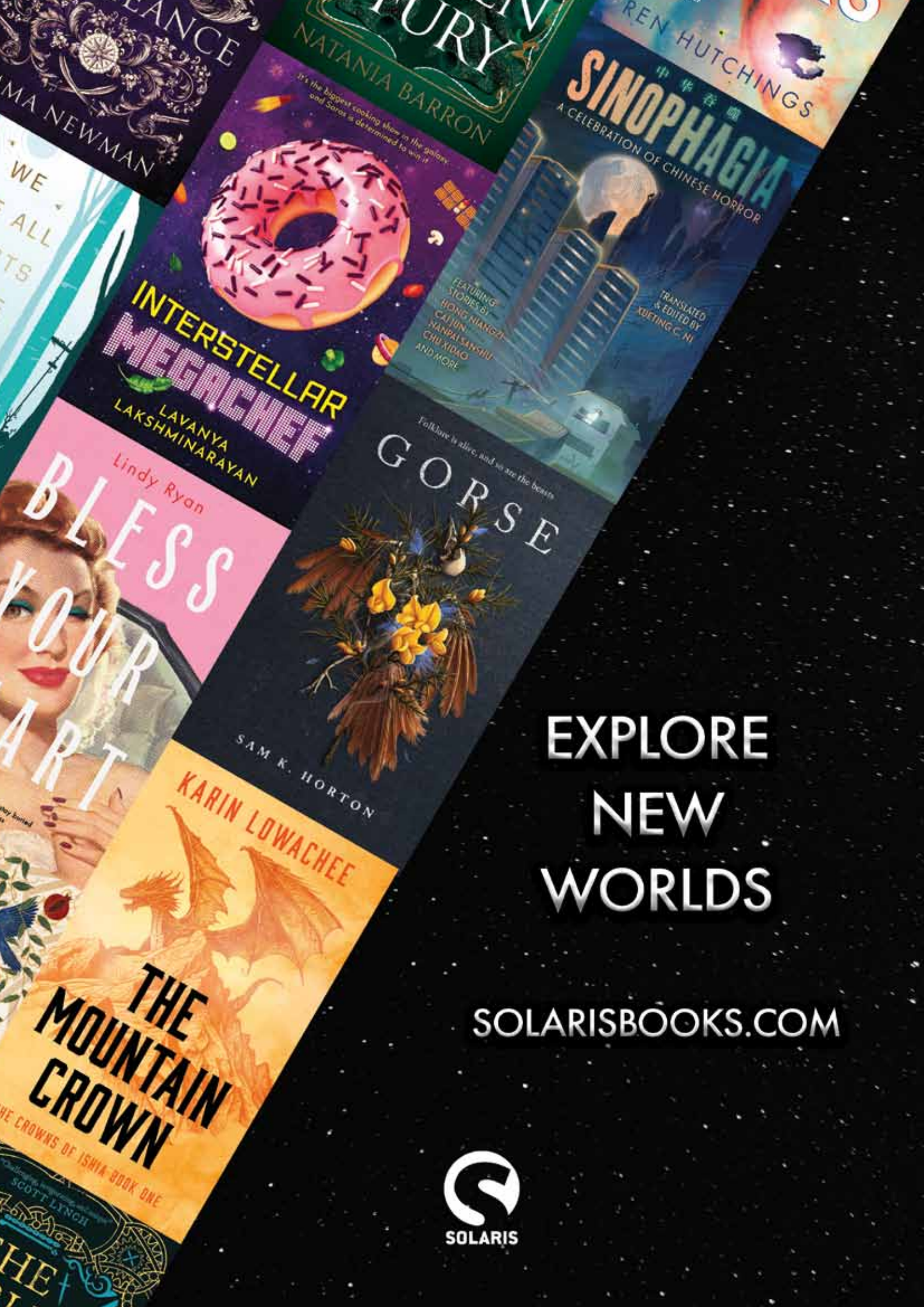

In addition, this is also an important step towards making Worldcon fandom more international. We should not ignore this region that accounts for 61% of the world's population.

Letter from the Editor

When I was first asked to help with the Progress Reports for LoneStarCon2, shortly after San Antonio won the bid in 1994, I had no idea what I was getting into. I had gone to two Oklahoma conventions – SoonerCon and the late OKon – each year since 1986, but had never been to a Worldcon. At that time I thought that the World Science Fiction Convention was hosted by some big organization for very special fans. Little did I realize that over Labor Day weekend of that same year, I had married one of the most active fans I know, Teddy Harvia, the anagrammatical alter ego of David Thayer.

In 1995, we went to Intersection in Glasgow. It was my first Worldcon, my first time out of the country (except for Mexico), and my first honeymoon. And my life will never be the same. It is hard to describe the effects of having ones awareness expanded exponentially in the short space of 5 days. There were so many things to see and do, so many people to meet, so many concepts to explore, so many differing cultures . . . and yet the best way I can describe it is like a vast family reunion, with an incredibly diverse pool of relatives.

By the time I went to Intersection, we had already published two Progress Reports for LoneStarCon2. “Ah,” I said to myself like the first blind man touching the tail of the elephant, “Now I know what a Worldcon is like.” I came home with a new vision to work



on more Progress Reports, confident in my new knowledge, but thankful that someone with more experience than I was scheduled to put together the Program Book.

At L.A.con III in 1996, I found even more of everything I had encountered at Intersection. And the feeling of a family reunion was intensified because so many of the people I had met at Intersection were there. I realized that now I not only had friends all over the country, but on three continents as well. (One of the highlights was going to lunch with five cartoonists and watching them bounce off each other.) So after feeling the elephant's trunk like the second blind man, I said to myself, “Now I know what a Worldcon is *really* like.” Once again I came home inspired to work on the Progress Reports. But at L.A.con III, Peggy Ranson, who I had been told was going to do the Program Book said, “Who, me?” and shook her head (unaware that someone had tossed her name in for a project she had already tackled for a prior Worldcon, Nolacon II). She was more than willing to let someone else assume the Program Book responsibilities. At that point I became first redundancy in the lineup of persons to do the job; there was still Pat Virzi who had said she would like to do it.

Then Pat took a hard look at her schedule and realized that just when she was going to have to put the most effort into the Program Book, she and husband Dennis would be spending most, if not all, of their weekends wrangling weeds and armadillos and chasing stray cattle on their homestead in Oklahoma.

Oops! The Program Book had just gone backup. I was it. Alright. Stay calm. After all, I'm a graphic artist by trade. I can handle the layout. But . . . what do I put in it?

“Not to worry,” said Teddy as he handed me a very heavy stack of past Worldcon Program Books. “Oh, my,” I thought, dismayed by the sheer bulk of information. I looked through them all. Then I looked through them again. By my third trip through a decade worth of Program Books, I was starting to see the continuities and the differences. I noticed that many of the names listed in all aspects of the books appeared year after year in varied capacities. And many of those names were people I had met. I also realized that there were a lot of people listed that I was curious about. At that point, I touched the side of the elephant and realized that fandom was much more like a family than I had thought, with relatives that one knows exist but barely recognizes.

My goal for the Program Book became clear. I wanted to include as many bios on as many program participants as I could get. I regret that I did not succeed in collecting all of them. Many thanks to those who responded to the programming questionnaire. Many thanks as well to Laurie Mann and Hutson Oper for helping collect information, to Bill Child for graphic support, to Bruce Pelz for checking the Worldcon history list against original sources, and especially to David Thayer for invaluable proofreading and moral support.

Has it been hard work? You bet! Would I trade the experience? Not for anything. What have I learned from all of this? That the World Science Fiction Convention is indeed put on by a *big* organization for very, *very* special people.
